Dear Mrs. Taylor,

I have written several letters today, among them one to Mrs. Hugham, & had just commenced one to you, when I was called off - so I resume at 12 p.m. You are aware that I have ventured away from home, but with much misgiving, as during the previous ten months I had not gone a distance of more than a mile. I have however managed better than I expected - Last week I spent three days at Mrs. Hugham's, where of course most of our time was occupied in the discussion of Mus^c matters, among which the proposed exhibition was prominent. Some of the things which I intended to send will not be required, as they will be supplied by others. This we settled while I was at Torquay, & I promised immediately on my return home to obtain some details as to my

contributions, which Hughan wishes to mention in the catalogue - I have today forwarded to him all these particulars. It is unnecessary to write them out for you, but I do enclose a list of the articles with the sizes of those which will be hung up, for your guidance - Knowing how fully your appeal for help has found favorable responses, I do not wonder that you feel almost appalled at the extent of the undertaking - but I feel assured that your energy will carry you successfully through it. I know something of such matters from my own experience in affairs of the kind from 30 to 40 years ago - You heard from Bro. Radway at the end of last week - I saw him at once on my return & it was by my advice that he wrote both to you & Hughan. Yesterday he showed me a framed Templar warrant, which had turned up unexpectedly. It is dated 1791 & had been in the possession of one of the P. M.'s of No. 41. I told him by all means to send it, so it must be added to the valuable documents entrusted to you

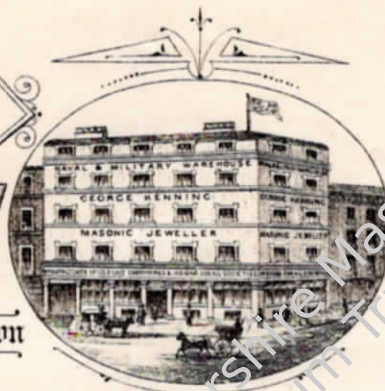

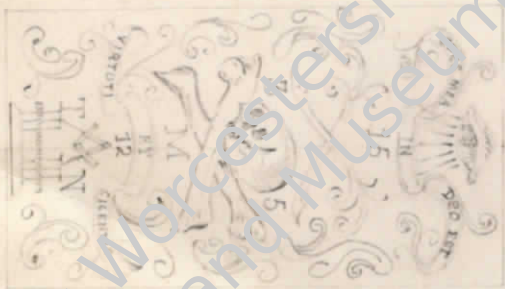
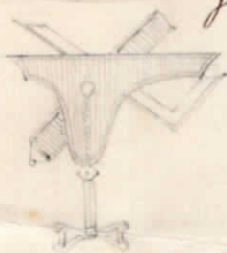
