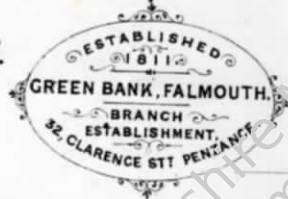

See page 16. Goid's "Pine and Bole" practically early ones by Pine, later ones by Bole.

The bole "Caractéristiques" was also engraved, & is an operative MS. (not speculative) see my "Old Charges", also Goid's "Antiquities" Vol. 1. (but none, by me, in "Old Charges")

It was issued in 1728-9 and 1731 (^{1728 & 1729} _{1728 & 1729})
Also ordinary edition (not engraved) in 1751 &c.
