EXTRACTS

FROM THE PROCEEDINGS AT THE GRAND CONCLAVE HELD ON
FRIDAY, MAY 11TH, 1855.

RESOLVED—"That all Encampments, to which warrants have already been, or shall hereafter be, granted, on the surrender of that under which they had previously acted, shall take rank in the Grand Conclave according to the dates of their original or surrendered warrants; and that the Grand Chancellor do send a Copy of this Resolution to all registered Encampments, requiring those who desire to claim the benefits of this Resolution to send in their claims specifying all particulars."

EXTRACTS FROM THE STATUTES.

The Grand Chancellor shall issue to each Past Grand Officer, and also to each Present and Future Grand Officer, who shall require it, a Diploma under his hand, and the Great Seal of the Order, on the appointment of such Grand Officer to his Office, on receiving the fee payable for the same. The fee is 7s. 6d.

The presence of the Eminent Commander, or Past Commander of some Encampment, and four other Knights at the least, is requisite to constitute a Meeting of an Encampment for the purpose of Installation of a Knight into the Order; but any other business may be transacted at a Meeting of an Encampment, if four, including an Eminent Commander or Past Commander, shall be present. The Warrant or Patent of Constitution must at all times be in the Encampment.

No Encampment shall, on any account or pretext whatsoever, provide any Knight with any Jewel or Costume whatsoever, except the Cloak or Mantle, Sword and Gauntlets, and except the Collar and Jewel to be worn by him as an Officer of the Encampment, and those only for the purpose of being worn in the Encampment,

and not elsewhere. But this provision shall not prevent any Encampment already provided with any Jewels, Badges, Sashes, or Baldrics, Swords, or other Costume, from permitting any Knight to wear, or use the same in the Encampment, but not elsewhere.

Every Encampment after having installed a Knight, shall forthwith register him in the Grand Conclave, and procure him a certificate of his registration.

No person, who shall not for the time being be a subscribing Member of some registered Encampment, shall be entitled to claim admission to, or be permitted to be present at any one Encampment more than once in any one year.

Every Encampment shall pay to the Funds of the Grand Conclave, on or before the 31st of March in each year, an Annual Sum of One Shilling for each Member of such Encampment. This Annual Sum is not to be payable for any Member of an Encampment for the year in which he shall have been first registered a Member of such Encampment.

N.B.—Grand Officers and Past Grand Officers, desirous of diplomas of their appointments, are requested to make early applications to the Grand Vice-Chancellor. On each Grand Officer's Diploma an illumined impression of the Jewel of his office will be given.

REPORT
OF
Grand Conclave of England and Wales,

Friday, 11th May, 1860.

YOUR Committee have on this occasion the melancholy duty of expressing their sense of the very great loss the Order has sustained in the very recent death of the late Grand Chancellor, SIR KNIGHT MASSON: to his unwearied exertions on behalf of the Order, and his unremitting labour to advance its welfare, must be attributed the great increase which has taken place in Temper Masonry throughout England and her dependencies.

At the last Meeting of the Committee, though then evidently ill-fitted from disease to perform the task, he took upon himself the preparation of the present report, which he had before his death placed in the Printer's hands, and this report, to which the Committee would add their present statement by way of introduction, will detail to you the progress and existing condition of the Order, as well as the anxiety of the late Grand Chancellor for its prosperity, and may be looked upon as his death-bed proof of zeal and devotion to its interests.

The time has now arrived which your Committee has long anticipated, and which the late Grand Chancellor had himself felt must shortly occur, when the very laborious nature of the Grand Chancellor's office would require a fresh arrangement of its duties, and the appointment of some salaried officer to keep properly the Returns, and answer the numerous applications from existing and contemplated Encampments.

The Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master, whose concurrence in their views on this subject the Committee are glad to announce, will propose to the Grand Conclave the name of a Sir Knight well known to the Order, FR. M. H. SHUTTLEWORTH, who has kindly consented to accept the office of Vice-Chancellor, and on whom it is proposed the duties as above-mentioned should for the most part devolve. Towards enabling him the better to fulfil the same a proposal for an allowance of an annual sum from the funds of the Grand Conclave will be made to you from the chair.

The Committee may congratulate the Order, that a Knight so competent can thus be found to undertake so onerous a task. Your Committee are afraid, that notwithstanding the great care and punctuality of the late Grand Chancellor, in consequence of his illness and death, some Encampments and individual Members may not have received acknowledgments of payments made by them, and that some communications may have remained unanswered. They regret as has already been done, the patience and forbearance of the Fraternity under the present trying circumstances, until the new arrangements have been perfected by time.

For the same reason, in the appointment of Grand Officers, they are unable to ascertain with any certainty, what correspondence has passed between the late Grand Chancellor and Provincial Grand Commanders and others, as to the names of Sir Knights to be submitted to the Grand Master for his favorable consideration and approval; and they regret that for the present year it is possible that the well-founded hopes of some Members of the Order for rank and distinction in the same, to which their position in society and progress in Templar Masonry most decidedly entitle them, may be disappointed by the late Grand Chancellor having been so suddenly called away from this world.

It is again in the power of your Committee to report with great satisfaction the increase and prosperity of the Order since the report of May, 1859, was published and placed in possession of all Provincial Grand Commanders and Eminent Commanders, presiding over Encampments at home and abroad, under fealty to our venerable Chief, Colonel CHARLES KEMEYS KEMEYS TYNTE, Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master of the Order.

Since its general distribution last year, Warrants have been granted to *Five* new Encampments,—*two* in England, *one* in India, *one* in Victoria, and *one* in a distinguished regiment in the British army; and demonstrations thus made, indicate that more Warrants will soon be required, where the Order is in high favor and making great progress.

The registration of new Members shews an increase of 160 within the year.

The Grand Treasurer's accounts have been carefully audited, and an abstract of the same published with this report shews how the different Encampments have given in their returns, and the very satisfactory position in which the financial affairs of the Grand Conclave rest.

The late Grand Chancellor had intimated that the system of examination in sections, in strict accordance with the Ritual of the Order, which he compiled and issued on authority, each set at 10s., had been found to work so well and instructively, that the receipts exceeded the expenses of getting it up, and the issue of the remaining number is in future to be entrusted to the Grand Vice-Chancellor, the surplus to form—by the desire of F. MASSON, the late Grand Chancellor—the foundation of a Special Charity Fund.

The Alms Fund, in the hands of the Grand Almoner, amounts to the sum of £21 12s. 9d., and the Collection of this day increases the same to £24 16s. 4d.

In conclusion, your Committee remark that many years have now elapsed since Colonel CHARLES KEMEYS KEMEYS TYNTE was happily and unanimously chosen the legitimate successor of his late lamented friend, His Royal Highness the DUKE OF SUSSEX, as Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master of the Order, during which long period thirty-six Encampments have been sanctioned by him, and added to the Muster-Roll of the Order, conferring the benefits of Christian Masonry over every part of the civilized world; and that the Knights Templar of Scotland, Ireland, and the United States of America, are in cordial confraternity with their brethren and respected companions, the Knights Templar of England and Wales.
