CORNELIUS VARLEY,

Cornelius Varley was one of the original founders the old Water Colour and Royal Microscopic Societies. He was a life number of the Society of Arts and of the British Association for the Advancement Science, and Visitor of the Royal Institution of Great Britain, &c., &c. He was born November 21st, 1781, Hackney, at what was previously the Blue Post Tavern, at which, with its large surrounding grounds, his ather, Richard Varley, had converted into a private residence. Through his mother, whose maiden name was Neetwood, he was a descendant of General Fleetwood, the married Oliver Cromwell's daughter Bridget.
