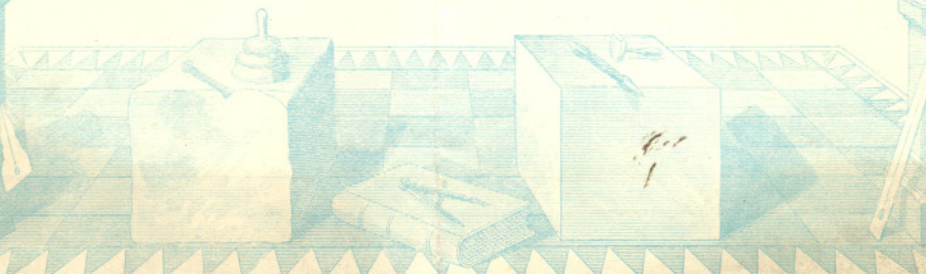

NOTE.—Any Brother desiring to propose a Candidate for Initiation, or Joining Member, is requested to first submit the name and particulars on the form provided by Grand Lodge, under Rules 184, 185, 189 and 190a, and send to the Secretary in time for the same to be considered by the Past Masters of the Lodge.

On the Candidate being approved the particulars will be issued to all Brethren of the Lodge, without the names of the proposer and seconder being stated. Should any Brother have any objection to the admission of the Candidate he is requested to inform the Secretary without delay in order that it may be reported for consideration.

If no objection be received, the Candidate will then be proposed and seconded in open Lodge in the usual manner, according to the Book of Constitutions.
