# Items of History Relating to the Tudor Lodge

## Petition to Grand Modge

The Petition for the formation of a new Longe meeting in Harborne to suit the convenience of Brethren living in that district, states the grounds of the petition, which may be summarised as follows:—

- 1. Desire for the prosperty of the Craft.
- 2. To promote and diffuse the true principles of Masonry.
- The convenience of the dwellings of the petitioners respectively.
- 4. Other good reasons.

The Petition was supported by the St. James' Lodge, No. 482, meeting at Undsworth, but no record can be found in the Minute Book of the Lodge for the year 1878. It was, however, signed on behalf of the Lodge by Wor. Bro. J. H. Parkes, W.M., Bro. J. F. Pepper, S.W., and Bro. John Deeley, J.W.

## Consecration Ceremony

The Consecration of the Tudor Lodge, No. 1792, took place at an Emergency Meeting of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Staffordshire, held at the New Inns, Handsworth, the Headquarters of St. James' Lodge, on Monday, 12th May, 1879. The Principal Officers were The Right Worshipful Brother ÆNEAS J. McIntyre (Acting Provincial Grand Master), Grand Registrar; The Right Worshipful Brother G. ## Summary of Principal Ebents

On the 12th May, 1879, following the Consecration of the Tudor Lodge, No. 1792, the first Wor. Master (Wor. Bro. Matthias J. Barker, P.M. 1016) was installed in the Chair by Wor. Bro. Dr. W. E. Parkes, I.P.M., of the St. James' Lodge, No. 482. It is hoped that Wor. Bro. Parkes will be present at the Jubilet Celebration.

The first six meetings of the Tudor Lodge were held at the New Inns Hotel, Handsworth, but on December 10th, 1877, the Lodge held its first meeting in its new home, Masonic Hall, Harborne (the property of the Harborne Masonic Hall, o.), and framed and passed its By-Laws on that date. The Lodge continued to meet at the Masonic Hall regularly full the Hall was purchased by the Birmingham Corporation for a Brap of Free Library. It was then removed to the Harborne Institute, where it regularly met from April 11th, 1892 [M. February 8th, 1915, when, in consequence of the conditions created by the War, the Harborne Institute was sold for business purposes. The Lodge then removed to the Connaught Rolm, Imperial Hotel, Birmingham, and some months later was transferred in a terrorice of Warwickshire. By the kindness of the Provincial Grand Master of Warwickshire the Worshipful Brethren who had received Provincial Grand Lodge Holowys in Stafford hire were allowed to retain like precedence in Warwickshire.

On the completion of the Meneria Temple, Broad Street, the Lodge removed there and held its Installation meeting—the first Installation to be hild in the New Temple—on October 10th, 1927. In all its various homes the Lodge has been able to retain its original night of meeting, the second Monday of the month.

In the course of its 50 years' existence the Lodge has been presided out by 49 Worshipful Masters, 25 of whom are still living and 22 are to-day members of the Lodge.

During this period 189 members have been initiated and 39 Brothen have joined the Lodge.

In the listory of the Lodge there have been only four Charles, in Treasurers, seven Charity Stewards, and four Tylers.

Proxincial Grand Lodge Honours have been conferred on 35 Wo, his ful Brethren of the Tudor Lodge, viz.: 21 in the Province of Statiordshire and 14 in the Province of Warwickshire.

It was in 1916 that the ceremony of Installation was changed in m May to October.

Wor. Bro. Bradley, who is one of the two surviving Founders of the Lodge, was Organist for 31 years, and on his retirement from the office a presentation of an illuminated address was made on 13th November, 1911. He had in 1895 been elected an Honorary Member in acknowledgment of his services to the Lodge.

The Records of the Regular Meetings of the Lodge are kept in eight Minute Books, comprising over 3,000 pages.
