The Most Worshipful The Grand Master having taken his position, the Brethren will remain standing to order while the National Anthem is played.

The Chairman of the Special Committee will request the Most Worshipful The Grand Master to lay the Foundation Stone.

* The Stone will be raised.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will address the Assembly:—

"Men and Brethren here a sembled to-day to behold this Ceremony, know all of year and we be awful Masons, true and faithful to the laws of our Country; and established of old with peace and honour, in most countrys, and engaged by solemn obligations to erect magnificent buildings to be serviceable to the Brethren, and to fear God, the Great Architect of the Universe

"We have amongst us, concealed from the eyes of all men, so trets which cannot be divulged, but these secrets are lawful and honourable, and not repugnant to the laws of God or man. They we're entrusted in peace and honour to Masons of antient times, and have been faithfully transmitted to us, and it is our duty to convey them unimpaired, to the latest posterity.

^{*} NOTE—The actual Stone at Great Queen Street has been presented by the three Lodges of those still in existence, which formed the original Grand Lodge in 1717 viz.—The Lodge of Antiquity No. 2, The Royal Somerset House and Inverness Lodge No. 4, and The Fortitude and Old Cumberland Lodge No. 12.

"Unless our Craft were good, and our calling honourable, we should not have lasted for so many centuries, nor should we have been honoured with the patronage of so many illustrious men in all ages, who have ever shewn themselves ready to promote our interests, and to defend us against all adversaries.

"We are here assembled to-day, in the presence of you all to assist in laying in antient form, the Foundation Stone of our Building as a house for Masonry, which we pray God may deserve to prosper by becoming a place of Concord for good men and for the promotion of Harmony and Protherly Love throughout the world, until time shall be no more."

Prayer by the Grand Chaplain :-

"Almighty and Eternal God, Great Architect of the Universe, who dost from Thy Throne behold all dwellers upon Earth, direct us in all our foings with Try most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works begun, continued under ided in Thre, we may glorify Thy Holy Name."

The Mos. Worshipf il The Grand Master will pass to the Stone and take up has position.

The Grand Treasurer will place a Phial in the Cavity containing the Roll and Coins of the Realm.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will ask the Grand Secretary to read the inscription on the Stone.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will spread the cement on the lower stone with the Trowel handed to him for the purpose.

The Upper Stone will then be lowered by three distinct movements and adjusted by the Grand Superintendent of Works.

At the end of each movement a Fanfare of Trumpets will be sounded, and as the Stone comes to rest, a green light will indicate by electrical connection, that the actual Foundation Stores or the Site in Great Queen Street has been laid.

The Most Worshipful the Pro Grand Master w. 1 Mand the Maul to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, who will adjust the Stone by striking it on the four corners, saving: "With Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence and Justice let our work be founded."

The Junior Grand Warden will hand the Plumb Rule to the Most Worshipful The Grand Moster, who will rove the Stone Plumb.

The Senior Grand Werden will hand the Level to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master who will prove the Stone Level.

The Deputy Frand Master will hand the Square to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, who will prove the Stone Square.

The Most Worst pful the Pro Grand Master will hand the Maul to the Most Worst ipful The Grand Master who will strike the Stone hree times with the Maul, saying: "By the power in me vested, and in the van e of the Great Architect of the Universe, I declare this Stone well and truly laid."

[†] The Maul is the Christopher Wren Maul, which is the property of, and has been lent for the occasion by, the Lodge of Antiquity No. 2.

The Grand Superintendent of Works (presenting the suggested Plans) says: "Most Worshipful Grand Master, deign to inspect and sanction the whole Design."

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master: "I will do so with pleasure" (inspects the Plans and hands them back). "With the implements of our Craft and these instructions, may you raise a super-structure, perfect in its parts and honourable to the hailded."

The Bearers of the Vessels containing the Corn, Wide Oil and Salt will take up their positions.

The Grand Chaplain: "There shall be a handful of CORN in the earth, upon the top of the mountains, the fruit thereof shall shake like Lebanon; and they of the City shall flourish like grass of the earth." (Psalm XXVII, v. XVI.)

The Brethren will sing

"When once of old in Is ael,

Our arty Erethren vrought with toil,

Jehova's blessings on them fell,

'a showers of Con and Wine and Oil."

The Yes els will be carried round the Stone and the Cornucopia containing the Corn will be presented to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master: "I scatter Corn on this Stone, the emblem of plenty, and may the all Bounteous Creator of the Universe shower down His choicest blessings on the members of this Community, and all who shall assemble in our building to the Glory of the Most High, until time shall be no more." The Grand Chaplain: "And for a drink offering, thou shalt offer the third part of an hin of WINE, for a sweet Savour unto the Lord." (Numbers, Chap. xv, v. vII.)

The Brethren will sing :-

"When there a Shrine to Him alone,
They built with worship sin to foil,
On threshold and on Corner stone,
They poured out Corn and Wine and Oil."

The Vessels will be carried round the Stone, and the Ewer containing the Wine will be presented to be Most Worshipful The Grand Master.

The Most Worshipful The Gread Master: "I pour wine on this Stone the emblem of joy and gladness, and may He whose name is Love, grant that we may reall of the heart and mind, and may we ever dwell together in prace and unity."

The Crand Chaplair: "And thou shalt make it an OIL of Holy ointment, an ointment compounded after the art of the apothecary, which shall be an Holy anointing Oil. And thou shalt anoint the Tebernacle of the Congregation therewith, and the Ark of the Testimony." (Exodus, Chap. xxx, v. xxv and xxvi.)

The Brethren will sing :-

"And we have come, fraternal bands,
With joy and pride, and prosperous spoil,
To honour Him with votive hands,
With streams of Corn and Wine and Oil."

The Vessels will be carried round the Stone, and the Ewer containing the Oil will be presented to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master: "I pour Oil on this Stone, the emblem of charity, and may God give us grateful hearts, and may we be ever ready cheerfully to relieve the wants of others."

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The Grand Chaplain: "And every oblation of thy meat of ring shalt thou season with SALT, neither shalt thou suffer the Salt of the Covenant of thy God to be lacking from thy meat offering With all thine offerings thou shalt offer Salt." (Leviticus, Chap. II, v. XIII.)

The Brethren will sing :-

"Now o'er our work this Salt ve hower.

Emblem of Thy conservan power.

And may Thy presence, Lord, we pray,

Keep this, our Tomple, from decay."

The Vessels will be carried round the Stone, and the Vessel containing the Salt will be presented to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master.

The Most Wor bipful The Grand Master: "I sprinkle Salt on this Stone, the emplem of his spitality and friendship, and may the all Bounceo's Author of Nature bless this District, the Country, and Kingdon an large with abundance of corn, wine and oil, and all the necessaries, comfirth and conveniences of life. And may the A mighty Archite t of the Universe look down with benignity upon our present undertaking, and crown the edifice of which we have now laid the Foundation with every success."

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will again occupy the Throne.
