My Dear Sir,

I hasten to enclose the copy - it is from the N 12 department, of the Greenroom,  
My Office is all upset by the bursting of a 100 Gal. Cask of Whiskey  
overhead during the night. I am obliged to you sending the article on to  
Colquhoun - I met Mr May Rose + Captain Mr Parodi, Chevalier of the  
Order of St. Stanislaus. He tells me he has found the Wend work of 1800 - & that  
for me - its existence is placed beyond doubt. It was not until Dec.  
or January that R- was coming to England - when he intends to get the

Sanction of the Ambassadors by the British  
Government for the General recognition of  
the Order. I learn that Mr. Oldham in  
Edinburgh that you & me are the first  
Grand Expos who will be appointed.  
I rather think the Grand Master of the Order  
the power of conferring other Titles.

I have just sent on to R - the Commemorative  
Chapter of a History of the Order - written  
(on the Conversion of Constantine). The whole  
will shortly be sent on to you, in your advice  
direction.

Smith the Editor of the Freeman, writes  
to me R - in Edinburgh on the 30th  
ult. when he takes his R + + 30 -  
+ R - intends to ask him to write this  
in a weekly Supplement of 2 pages  
to do up the size of our books, &  
then to print off a few Copies -

Doyle writes to me to say that every effort  
is about to be made by the Masonic Order to  
get the Order to sanction them - I advise  
him to stand well with both - but of course  
in no case will there be the Partial shadow  
of an amalgamation allowed.
