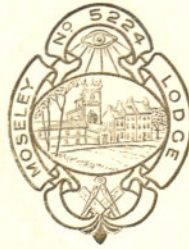

3. The Lodge is opened in the Three Degrees

All created things were made; Ever blest with order be;
Heaven and earth Thy vast design; And may we when labours cease
Hear us, Architect Divine. Part in harmony and peace.

On threshold and on Corner-stone,

29. The Consecrating Officer pours wine—the symbol of Joy and Cheerfulness.

32. The Brethren sing—

And we have come fraternal bands,
With joy and pride, and prosperous spoil
To honour Him by votive hands
With streams of Corn, and Wine and Oil.

33. The Consecrating Officer pours Oil—the symbol of Peace and Unanimity

34. MUSICAL RESPONSE.—Glory be to God on High

35. The Chaplain reads Leviticus, chap. ii., verse 13

36. The Brethren sing—

Now o'er our work this salt we shower,
Emblem of Thy conservant power;
And may Thy presence, Lord, we pray,
Keep this our temple from decay.

37. The Consecrating Officer sprinkles Salt—the symbol of Fidelity and Friendship
