# Short Resume of the Lodge History

THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT LODGE, then styled Connaught Lodge, was consecrated at the Victoria Masonic Temple on Tuesday, December 4th, 1902, by Wor. Bro. J. N. CAMPBELL, P.M., P.Z., assisted by Wor. Bro. HERCULES J. SCOTT as S.W., Wor. Bro. G. H. ALSTON as J.W., Wor. Bro. SIR EDWIN HAYWARD as Organist.

The first W.M. was Wor. Bro. JOHN SPICER, and his Officers were :— Bro. J. W. S. ATTYGALLE, S.W. ; Bro. W. A. STONE, J.W. ; Wor. Bro. L. W. KERSHAW, Treasurer ; Wor. Bro. J. N. GRANT, Secretary ; Wor. Bro. A. WOODSON, S.D. ; Bro. A. A. MIX, J.D. ; Bro. J. WALKER, I.G. ; and Bro. J. C. BAY, Tyler.

At the first regular meeting held on 22nd January, 1903, the under-mentioned were duly elected :—

Bro. W. R. BURNETT, 605 E.C., as joining Member.

Bro. J. CROWE, 611 S.C., as Affiliating Member.

The first Initiation took place on 19th March, 1903, when Dr. ALLAN MORGAN DE SARAM was the candidate.

In March, 1928, the Lodge was honoured by the visit of a deputation from the Grand Lodge of England, comprising the following distinguished Brethren :—Rt. Wor. Bro. THE RT. HON. LORD CORNWALLIS, C.B.E., Deputy Grand Master of England ; V. W. Bro. SIR JOHN FERGUSON, K.B.E., Past Grand Treasurer ; V. Bro. SIR KENNETH STUDD, O.B.E., Past Grand Deacon, and W. Bro. L. COL. THE HON. S. PLEYDELL-BOUVERIE, D.S.O., O.E.F. Deputy Grand Director of Ceremonies.

At a Special Meeting of the District Grand Lodge held on Thursday, 11th September, 1930, Wor. Bro. A. WOODSON, P.A.G. Supt. of Works, P.D.G.W., a Founder Member of this Lodge was installed District Grand Master for Ceylon.
