members a set of fellows - stated he is not set in the room with
any set of fellows - These observations lasted for 3 or 4 minutes
I could not see B. Godby leave room ^{after called upon to see B. Godby had no} ^{and on the table was such}

minutes to meet of Lodge B. Godby took ^{minutes} ^{secl} out of B. Palmer's hand & said what does
this (called the certain minutes) in this hall - I returned it was before
Lodge opened. His acts words & conduct are ^{capable} of exposing
the asked questions & answered them himself.

B. Palmer. S. M. stated upon B. O'Hara's stated read over that it
accorded with his recollection except one particular viz - That B. Palmer
was opened before Godby came in. It was when he saw B. O'Hara & when
he rebuked as it is he had how he came into chair - said he had no title to take
Master's observation in this respect. Distinctly heard B. Godby call himself
a bloody liar - Reminded him he was not a Master & asked him
if he sat in the room with him called him to be a bloody liar.

Concluded. B. O'Hara as to conversation & the observation was made
B. Godby left room after commencement of prayer - B. O'Hara was read Master
was more than commended. As he was read Lodge said he is not set among
such a set of fellows

B. Wally. never saw such disgraceful conduct for 24 yrs he is a Mason.
Generally corroborate B. O'Hara's stated - B. Godby called him a drunkard.
It was in reply to observation that they are members of support when
it was in reply to observation of Wally that members about themselves on S. John's
acted blackguardly & disgracefully - B. Godby was about a minute after
prayer commenced - B. Godby went out of room & spoke to Godby after he
left the room but cannot say whether prayer was then over or not
or whether it was before candidate entered

Mr. Godby was taking his position at the table & chair when called to the table.

Treasurer

B. Caulfield P.M. raised objection that meeting was irregular. He would not listen at all. - W. said he never heard such language used by Master to a P.M. before or with his table closed. -

B. Lewis states Minute entered was correct & uncorrected, altered by W.M. - The statement of proceed Brothers substantially correct. W. Johnson corroborates previous statement.

W.M. Mr. Godby asked me also made the Master. W. said he did not attend on B. Johnson's night, he would not give him any answer. Mr. Godby asked ^{some} questions & with respect replied that he did not attend. Asked Godby to sit down as he was causing confusion. He would say he had no right to speak. Did not hear anything said by whose authority he called a P.M. July called. - Did not sit down to sit down. He appeared very quiet & W.M. had become to complain of his demeanor. - He appeared upon the unaltered or uncorrected Minute. Mr. Godby asked the W.M. by whose authority the meeting of last evening was called. B. Caulfield said it was wrong to sit with table closed. - Did not remember W.M. say that he was P.M. & Treasurer & ought to be excused.

B. Palmer S.W. cannot say what was not asked by whose authority but heard Caulfield ask the Master. Who would turn Master? Caulfield threw the paper down.

As to Suspension of Mr. Godby.

The meeting was plainly irregular under 22nd Rule of Lodge. Let W. Johnson replied that such was announced by letter of W. Johnson, 11th of July. - The notice served upon Mr. Godby was dated the 16th of July 1863. Required Mr. Godby to appear before the 16th of July. A letter or notice was produced.

As to calling on Mr. Godby to resign.

The calling upon a brother to resign was ~~unwarranted~~ done by the advice of P.M. of the Lodge & of his own authority.

As to the seal of the Lodge.
