The Rt. Hon. Viscount Burnham, C.H., President of the Trustees of the Shakespeare Memorial Theatre, will request the M.W. Pro Grand Master to lay the Foundation Stone.

The Stone will be raised.

The M.W. Pro Grand Master will address the Assembly.

Prayer by the Grand Chaplain :

"Almighty and Eternal God, Great Architect of the Universe, who dost from Thy Throne behold all dwellers upor Earth, direct us in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Thee we may glorify Thy Holy Name." So mote it be. on'

The M.W. Pro Grand Master will pass to the Stone.

The President of the Board of General Furposes will place a Phial containing Papers and Coins of the Realm in the Cavity.

The M.W. Pro Grand Master will ark the Grand Secretary to read the inscription on the Stone, and place the Plate over the Cavity.

The Architect (Niss Elisabeth Scott, A.R.I.B.A.) will present the Trowel.

The M.W. Fro Grand Master will spread the cement on the lower stone with the Tro yel.

The Upper Store will then be lowered by three distinct movements and adjuited by the Grand Superintendent of Works.

The M.W. Fro Grand Master will adjust the Stone by striking it on the four corners with the Maul handed to him for the purpose, saying: "With Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence and Justice let our work be founded."

The Junior Grand Warden will hand the Plumb Rule to the M.W. Pro Grand Master, who will prove the Stone Plumb.

The Senior Grand Warden will hand the Level to the M.W. Pro Grand Master, who will prove the Stone Level.

The Deputy Grand Master will hand the Square to the M.W. Pro Grand Master, who will prove the Stone Square.

The M.W. Pro Grand Master will strike the Stone three times with the Maul handed to him for the purpose, saying: "By the power in me vested, and in the name of the Great Architect of the Universe, I declare this Stone well and ray laid."

The Grand Superintendent of Works (presenting the sug gested Plans) says : "M.W. Pro Grand Master, deign to inspecthe whole Design."

The M.W. Pro Grand Master : "I will do so with pleasure" (inspects the Plans and hands them back). "With the implements of our Craft and these instructions, may there be raised a superstructure, perfect in its parts and honourable to the builders."

The Bearers of the Vessel's containing the Corn, Wine, Oil and Salt will take up their position.

The Grand Chap ain . "There shall be an handful of CORN in the earth, up (n) he top or the mountains; the fruit thereof shall shake life 'ebanon, and they of the City shall flourish like grass of the earth." (Proha LXXII, v. 16.)

The Brechren will sing:

"When once of old in Israel,

Our early Brethren wrought with toil,

Jebovah's blessings on them fell,

In showers of Corn and Wine and Oil."

The Vessels will be carried round the Stone and the Cornucopia containing the Corn will be presented to the M.W. Pro Grand Master.

The M.W. Pro Grand Master : "I scatter Corn on this Stone, the emblem of plenty, and may the all Bounteous Creator of

the Universe shower down His choicest blessings on the members of this Community, and all who shall assemble in this building to the Glory of the Most High, until time shall be no more."

The Grand Chaplain : "And for a drink offering, thou shalt asolli offer the third part of an hin of WINE, for a sweet Savour unto the Lord." (Numbers, Chap. XV, v. 7.)

The Brethren will sing:

"When there a Shrine to Him alone, They built with worship sin to foil, On threshold and on Corner stone, They poured out Corn and Wine and Co

The Vessels will be carried round the Store, and the Ewer containing the Wine will be presented to the M.W. Pro Crand Master.

The M.W. Pro Grand Master : "Y pour wine on this Stone, the emblem of joy and gladness, and may He whose name is Love, grant that we may be all of one hear) and mind, and may we ever dwell together in peace and unity."

The Grand Chaplein : 'And those shalt make it an OIL of Holy ointment, an oir ment compounded after the art of the apothecary, which shall be an Holy anointing Oil. And thou shalt anoint the Tabernacle of the Congregation therewith, and the Ark of the Testinony." (Exodus, Chap. XXX, v. 25 and 26.)

The Brethren will sing:

"A.d ve have come, fraternal bands, With joy and pride, and prosperous spoil, To honour Him with votive hands, With streams of Corn and Wine and Oil."

The Vessels will be carried round the Stone, and the Ewer containing the Oil will be presented to the M.W. Pro Grand Master.

The M.W. Pro Grand Master: "I pour Oil on this Stone, the emblem of charity, and may God give us grateful hearts, and may we be ever ready cheerfully to relieve the wants of others."

The Grand Chaplain: "And every oblation of thy meat offering shalt thou season with SALT, neither shalt thou suffer the Salt of the Covenant of thy God to be lacking from thy meat offering. With all thine offerings thou shalt offer Sat." (Leviticus, Chap. II, v. 13.)

The Brethren will sing:

"Now o'er our work this Salt we shower, Emblem of Thy conservant po ver And may Thy presence, Lord, ve pray, Keep this, our Building, from decay."

The Vessels will be carried round the Stone, and the Vessel containing the Salt will be presented to the M.W. Pro Grand Master.

The M.W. Pro Grand Master: "1 sprinkle Salt on this Stone, the emblem of lospitalit, and friendship, and may the all Bounteous Author of Nature cless this District, the Country, and Kingdom a large with abundance of corn, wine and oil, and all the processaries, conforts and conveniences of life. And may the Almighty Architect of the Universe look down with benignity upon our present undertaking, and crown the edifice of v hich we have now laid the Foundation with every success."

The M W Pro Grand Master will return to his Chair.

Prayer by the Grand Chaplain :

Blessed be Thy Name, O Lord God, for that it hath pleased Thee to have Thy habitation among the sons of men upon earth, and to dwell in the midst of their assemblies. Bless, we beseech Thee, the work we have this day begun in Thy name. May the Edifice about to be erected on this foundation stone be completed to Thy Honour and Glory, and may those who shall hereafter use the building, dedicate and devote their lives to Thy service, and evermore praise and magnify Thy Holy Name." So mote it be.

The Grand Chaplain will pronounce the Benediction :

"May the God of our Fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the Angel of the Everlasting Covenant, who has redeemed us from evil, the Holy One who sanctifieth us, Bless, Preserve, and keep you evermore." So mote it be.
