PROGRAMME.

The Brethren of the New Lodge and Visitors, will assemble in the Lodge Room, at 2 p.m.
The Lodge will be opened in the first degree by the W. M., and the Minutes of the last Meeting read and confirmed.

The Right Worshipful the Provincial Grand Master, Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Provincial Grand Officers, having formed in the Ante-room, enter the Lodge, marshalled by the Deacons and Directors of Ceremonies.

The Provincial Grand Master takes the Chair, and his Officers their respective places.
The W. M. and Members of the New Lodge, range themselves in the West.

The Chaplain offers up prayer.

Musical Response,—"So Mote it be."
ODE,--To Heaven's High Architect all praise,
All praise, all gratitude be given;
Who deigned the human soul to raise,
By mystic secret spring from Heaven,
CHORUS,--Sound aloud the Great Jehovah's praise,
To Him the Dome of Temple raise.

A Brother of eminence addresses the R. W. Prov. G. and Master,—
The Provincial Grand Master addresses the New Lodge, and calls on their Secretary to read the Dispensation and the Minutes of the proceedings of the New Lodge while under Dispensation, which, if approved, he signs.
The P. G. M. calls on the Secretary to read the Warrant.
The P. G. M. addresses the New Lodge and inquires if the Officers named in the Warrant are approved by the Brethren.

The assent being signified in Masonic form, the Jewels and Colours of the Officers are delivered by the W. M. to the P. G. M., who presents them, to the P. G. M.,
The W. M. is presented to the R. W. P. G. M., to whom he delivers the Warrant of Constitution.
The Lodge is unveiled.

The Brethren kneel while the P. G. Chaplain offers the Prayer of Consecration.

Musical Response,—"So Mote it be."
P. G. M.—Glory be to God on High, and in Earth peace, good will towards men.
CHANT—As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end, Amen.
Three Masters or Past Masters take the Vessels of Corn, Wine and Oil, and sprinkle the elements of Consecration on the Lodge, during solemn music.

The P. G. Chaplain takes the Consecration passes slowly round the Shrine three times, dedicates the Lodge, and offers up the Dedication Prayer.
