Order of Proceedings

1. The Worshipful Master, Officers and Brethren take their respective places in the Lodge Room at 4.30 o'clock precisely.
2. The Director of Ceremonies announces the presence of the Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master of Warwickshire, Grand Lodge Officers and Provincial Grand Lodge Officers who then enter the Lodge in procession. (The Brethren stand to order.)
3. The Masonic National Anthem:

God save our lord the King, Long may King George reign,
God save the King;

Send him victorious, Happy and glorious, Long to reign
over us,
God save the King.

Hail, mystic Light Divine, May'st Thou ne'er cease to shine,
Over this land;

Wisdom in Thee we find, Beauty and strength combined,
Masons are ever joined
In heart and hand.

Come then ye sons of Light, In joyous strains unite,
God save the King.

Long may King George reign, King of the azure main,
Masons resound the strain,
God save the King.

4. The Lodge is opened in the First Degree.
5. The Secretary reads the circular convening the Meeting, also the Dispensation to hold the same.
6. The Director of Ceremonies calls upon the Brethren to salute the Rt. Wor. Prov. Grand Master, the Deputy Prov. Grand Master, and the Assistant Prov. Grand Master of Warwickshire.
7. The Secretary reads the Minutes of the last regular Lodge.
8. The Director of Ceremonies calls upon the Brethren to salute the Officers and Past Officers of the Grand Lodge of England who are present.
9. The Chaplain offers up prayer :—

Vouchsafe Thine aid, Almighty Father and Supreme Ruler of the Universe, to our present convention, and grant that all the Brethren now assembled to praise Thee may so dedicate and devote their lives to Thy service as to become more and more true and faithful in the service of God and of man. Endue them with a competency of Thy divine Wisdom, that, assisted by the secrets of our Masonic art, they may the better be enabled to unfold the beauties of true godliness to the honour and glory of Thy Holy Name.

10. The Worshipful Master welcomes the Rt. Wor. Prov. Grand Master of Warwickshire, Grand Lodge Officers and the Visitors, and addresses the Brethren.

11. The Worshipful Master presents the Old Charter of the Lodge and the Centenary Warrant to the Rt. Wor. Prov. Grand Master for his inspection.
12. The Rt. Wor. Prov. Grand Master directs the Provincial Grand Secretary to read the Old Charter and the Centenary Warrant granted by the Most Worshipful Grand Master.
13. The Rt. Wor. Prov. Grand Master congratulates the Lodge on its Centenary.
14. The Rt. Wor. Prov. Grand Master hands the Charter and the Centenary Warrant to the Worshipful Master, and directs the proceedings to be recorded in the Minutes of the Lodge.
15. The Chaplain offers up prayer:—

We supplicate the continuance of Thine aid, O Merciful Lord, on behalf of ourselves and all our lawful undertakings. May Thine unseen presence be ever felt in all our Lodges, so that all words and works therein may follow after Thy Wisdom, Thy Truth, and Thy Love. Especially we pray Thee of Thy mercy to behold and to prosper our schools wherein we nurture and train the children of our Brethren who have passed away, and also all those our Brethren whose old age we strive to brighten and to sustain by the charity that Thou dost inspire. May these and all our other works begun in Thy Name be continued to Thy glory, and evermore established in us by obedience to Thy precepts, O Thou that art the Author and the Rewarder of our faith.

16. The Rt. Wor. Prov. Grand Master invests the Worshipful Master and the Brethren with their Centenary Jewels, and presents them with a copy of the History of Guy's Lodge.

17. The Brethren all sing :—

Now thank we all our God,
With heart, and hands, and voices,
Who wondrous things hath done,
In Whom His world rejoices;
Who from our mother's arms
Hath bless'd us on our way,
With countless gifts of love,
And still is ours to-day.

O may this bounteous God
Through all our life be near us,
With ever joyful hearts
And blessed peace to cheer us;
And keep us in His grace,
And guide us when perplex'd,
And free us from all ills
In this world and the next.

All praise and thanks to God
The Father now be given,
The Son, and Him Who reigns
With Them in highest Heaven,
The One Eternal God,
Whom earth and Heav'n adore,
For thus it was, is now,
And shall be evermore.

18. The Chaplain offers up prayer :—

Almighty and Everliving God, Who hast taught us to make prayers and supplications, and to give thanks, for all men; We humbly beseech Thee most mercifully to receive

these our prayers which we offer unto Thy Divine Majesty; beseeching Thee to inspire continually our Fraternity with the spirit of truth, unity and concord. We beseech Thee also to save and defend the Kings and Governors of whatsoever land in which our Brethren be, and specially Thy servant George, our King, that under him we may be godly and quietly governed. Guide, uphold, and bless the Most Worshipful our Grand Master, Arthur, Duke of Connaught, the Pro. Grand Master and the Deputy Grand Master, the Provincial Grand Master, Deputy Provincial Grand Master and the Assistant Provincial Grand Master of Warwickshire, together with all other Provincial and District Grand Masters. Guide, also, Thou source of all Wisdom, all those who in Grand Lodges bear rule, and especially in the Grand Lodge of England, that their deliberations and conclusions may ever be worthy of the respect and obedience of the Craft. And to all our brethren, initiates, fellowcrafts, master masons and officers, give Thy Heavenly Grace; and especially to this congregation here present; that with meek heart and due reverence, aided by the principles and reminded by the ritual of the Order, they may hear and receive Thy Holy Word, truly serving Thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of their life. And we most humbly beseech Thee of Thy goodness, O Lord, to comfort and succour all our Brethren wheresoever dispersed over the face of land or sea, who are distressed by trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity, giving them a speedy release, if it be Thy Will, from all their sufferings, and, should they desire it, a safe return to their native land. And we also bless Thy Holy Name for all our Brethren departed this life in Thy faith and fear; beseeching Thee to give us grace so to follow their good examples, that with them we may be united in The Grand Lodge Above and partakers of Thy Heavenly Kingdom. Look upon them, Most High, for good, and give them rest where the light of Thy countenance shines upon them, so that both they and we may continually lift our eyes to that bright Morning Star whose rising brings peace and salvation to the faithful and obedient of the human race.
