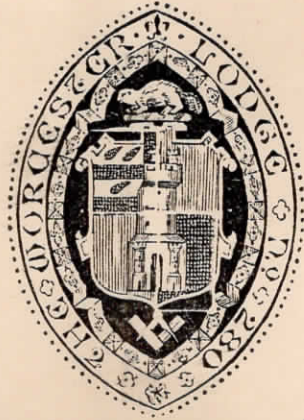

 - 7.—To transact any other business which may arise for the good of Masonry in general, or Lodge 280 in particular.
