### ATTENTION IS CALLED TO BYE-LAWS NO. 9 AND 15:

"The Yearly Subscription to the Lodge shall be TWO AND HALF GUINEAS, PAYABLE HALF-YEARLY, IN ADVANCE, IN THE MONTHS OF MARCH AND SEPTEMBER; any Member being Two Years in arrear shall be liable to Exclusion under Article 210 'Book of Constitutions,' and the same reported to Grand Lodge and Provincial Grand Master."

### EXTRACTS FROM THE BOOK OF CONSTITUTIONS.

"No Lodge shall pay the Quarterly Contributions (to Grand Lodge) for a Member who is in arrear, but his name shall be returned with the words 'in arrear' written against it. Should a Member be excluded, or withdraw himself from a Lodge without having paid up, he is not eligible to join another Lodge without that Lodge making due enquiry, failing which, such Lodge is liable to pay all arrears due to the Lodge he formerly belonged to."
