Wth & Dear Brother,

I regret much that I missed seeing you yesterday, as upon reference to the Books you would have seen exactly how affairs re N^o 59 stand - Still I will do my best to lay it before you as distinctly as I can - ditto, after all, your affairs are not half so bad as you think.

I extract this from G.L. Ledger to show you that the amm: due have been paid

to Decr. 1870. and that four Certificates
were duly paid for. Consequently
there is due to Grand Lodge,
Annual dues for the year 1871 ^{and 1872}
of \$- each member or 6 per quarter,
with fees for Certificates joining (if any).

With regard to your Secretary's
Statement that no Returns for us
have reached, the answer is simply
that no Returns of W. M. officers
has been sent us since you took
leave in the Chair that was in
1871 - I do not know know
who is W. M. or Secretary, and
therefore know not to whom to send
of L. Communication, Circular &c &c.

So that no excuse can be made again,
I send per Book Post Returns of all
Rents - Contributions for which fee is 2/-
which I will thank you to hand
to Secretary - Returns I will send
as soon as I receive a supply which
is daily expected -

The increase of fees is as per enclosed
Circular. started place on the
1st January 1874 -
