We really did nothing at the Grand
Privy on Friday last. The Report
of the Committee was taken without
a word and we elected the members
of the Grand Masters Council and
that was all we did. It appears
that through the instrument the
Grand Masters received at the Grand
Privy on Earl Shrewsbury's invitation
they have taken precipitant and
have withdrawn their consent to the
proposed alterations in the Statutes
and at present have refused to
recognise Shadwell's Motion as
the last Grand Privy standing still
rooted on the terms of the Imperfect

which was to a certain extent
things obliterated. I felt sure from
the way the Irish Guild were
received and dealt with that
the Judgment would fall on the
Great Priory some day and here
it is. Until the Great Priory of
Ireland is consolidated again
we are practically in the same
place we were 40 years ago & I
feel it to be well nigh unwise to
260.
