Just a line in haste to say

1. Every officer has to pay, before an appointment, one month's notice in advance to the Warden, and is not, unless special notice is given, a P.G.M. or a T.G.D. or a S.G.D. If we do the fee is permissible again all the same, and is not subject to any deduction for previous offices held, but to an increase of 5/- if a P.G.M. has not been served.
2. We do not transfer the P.W.M., as to fringe office to absentees. Do not consider we can help. He himself says, nothing must be invested in P.W.M.
