W. A. Schwartz, a member of the Class of 1922, on behalf of his Class, presented a beautiful gift to Sam Hartman from the members of his class with a fine speech in which he set forth the warm feeling and regard which the members of his class had for their Master.

To cap the climax, W. Sam Hartman then, on behalf of Paul Revere Lodge presented to each one of our visitors a beautiful Anniversary gift of Paul Revere Lodge and the sentiments which he expressed in making the presentation showed that Sam was deeply moved and appreciative of the splendid tributes which had been paid to him by Paul Revere Lodge and those of his friends who were present on this occasion. He said, that it was a night, the memory of which, he would long treasure among the most pleasant associations of his life.

It was announced at this meeting that the mothers of both Brothers, Ernest Janowitz and Albert Tepper had passed away. Sincerest condolence of the lodge are extended to both of these brothers.

While on the subject of the camp, it would be well for every brother to read the following inspiring tribute paid to Camp 7 by the Grand Master at the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge on May 6th, 1930:

"I had the pleasure of visiting the Seventh District Camp again last summer.

The Brethren of the District had made much progress in the development of the grounds and the addition of buildings during the previous year. Among other things a commodious and most cheerful dining room had been erected and several dormitories added. It is now a well-equipped Camp with modern and up-to-date sanitary improvements and capable of housing more than one hundred girls at a time.

The Camp provides for the care of girls only who are taken from crowded homes in this city, and given an outing of three weeks at this Camp.

Last year three relays of about one hundred girls each, were thus provided for. I understand the Brethren hope to receive four relays during the coming season.

The Camp has been established and the expense of its maintenance is borne entirely by our Brethren of the Seventh District of Manhattan. . . .

All of this work is highly commendable, and as the years go by it is to be hoped that the spirit to do something for the needy and worthy will spread and such work to be taken up by all of our districts."
