The Consecrating Officer scatters Corn : the Symbol of Plenty and Abundance, Musical Response-Glory be to God on high. The Chaplain reads Nehemiah, chap. x., verse 39. The Brethren sing :

250. The Consecrating Officer pours Wine : the Symbol of Joy and Cheerfulness. Musical Response-Glory be to God on high. The Chaplain reads Exodus, chap. xxx., verses 25 and 26. The Brethren sing :

And we have come fraternal bands, With joy, and pride, and prosperous spoil To honour Him by votive hands, With streams of corn, and wine, and ojc.

The Consecrating Officer pours Oil : the Symbol of Peace and Unanimity

Musical Response-Glory be to God on high,

The Brethren are arranged round the Lodge Board, friding outwards.

The Chaplain reads Leviticus, chap. ii., verse 13

The Brethren sing :

Now o'er our work this salt we now c. Emblem of Thy construct power, And may Thy is eserce, Lord, we pray Keep this The Zemple from decay.

The Consecrating Officer sprinkles Salt : the Symbol of Fidelity and Friendship. Musical Response-Glory be to God on high.
