St. Andram was tig ilest disirie of our Lord who brou;ht his brother Simon Peter to Jesus $\quad$-ist. St Andrew preached extensively in Asie minor and in Greace anc was ultimateis crucified in Patras on a diagenal cross with the arms ara +egs extaded in tne form of St. Andew's Cross.

As ir oche degree. in dusory tnere is a Fire which you will receive here for tho Hrgt tare It is based on the St. Andrem's Cross and is given SILENTLY and with : EVITENCE. It signifies our faith in our Risen Lord Our Gt. 1 .
