THE LECHMERE LODGE.No. 1874.

The Consecration of this Lodge took place under the Banner of the Hope & Charity Lodge.No.377, at the Masonic Hall, Mill Street, on 23rd February, 1881.

The Rt.Worshipful Provincial Grand Master, Sir E.A.H.Lechmere, Bart., had given his name to the Lodge and also granted permission for the Family Arms to be used as the Lodge Banner.

The Prov.G.Master performed the Ceremony of Consecration, and delivered a most impressive address on the principles of Masonry and an explanation of his Armorial Bearings which denict the Pelican, an antient symbol recognised as an emblem of (harity and Benevolence. (The antient family motto "Christus Pelicana")

The Founders intended Lechmere Lodge to be a class lodge. The membership was restricted by the By-laws to a total of 50, but as a fact it never exceeded 25. Membership was selected from Business and Professional gentlemen and I would suggest that as this rule was carried out the progress of the Lodge was slow and without doubt was the eventual cause of its longeal.

In 188° W.Bro.W.H. Talbot (Solicitor) was W.M. and during that year have Candidates were initiated but from then until 1894 (six years) one initiation took place and the membership by that time had been greatly reduced.

It is recorded that on several occasions it was not possible to open the lyige owing to insufficient numbers and when a candidate was proposed to the Secretary the proposer was advised that it was unfair to bring the name forward owing to the state of the Lodge.

A By-law which is rather unusual is X1X "Membership of this shall be forfeited ipso facto on any member being convicted of felony or misdemeanour, or on becoming bankrupt". There is no record of this law being applied.

The following Brethren occupied the Chair of Lechmere Lodge whilst at Kidderminster :- Initiates.

In 1895 it was found impossible to continue to work the Loage owing to lack of members and on many occasions the Loage was not opened for this reason.

W.Bro.R.Edger was W.Master at the time and during his Mastership the work was carried out by brethren from the Warwickshire Volunteer Force. 31 Initiates and joining members were added to the roll.

During the year 1894 W.Bro.A.F.Godson attended the Lodge and suggested that it should be resuscitated by removal.

Certain members of the Warwickshire Fores had for some time been trying to obtain a Warrant for the formation of a Military Lodge in that County, but their efforts were rejected by Provincial and Grand Lodge. W.Bro.G.Taylor (then Prov.2.Sec. of Worcestershire) with the assistance of W.Bro.C.D. Laton obtained permission of the Masefield Lodge of Balsall Heath to share their rooms at the Institute if permission was granted for the transfer of Lechmere Lodge. Balsall Heath was at the time in the Province of Worcestershire. The transfer as duly obtained and the first meeting took place at Balsall Heath on 4th.September,1895. W.Bro.Edgar opened the Lodge and the commony was conducted from them by W.Bro.Capt.British. I quote from the records of that time "Every Candidate for Initiation or joining shall be a member of the Regular Auxiliary, or Volunteer Forces, of not lower rank than Corporal, or ex-member'. Parmission was granted by Grand Lodge for the name of the Lodge to be changed to The Lechmere Volunteer Lodge No.1874.

The listallation date, which hitherto had been in March, was changed to Outcher in order that Bro.C.D.Eaton could qualify for the Master's Chair.

So the Lectmere Lodge departed from Kidderminster, the town of its birth.

It should be noted that the name of W.Bro.J.E.Green (1893) hardly attended the Lodge during his year in the Chair, in fact on one occasion only three members were present (the S.W. and two others). The obvious lack of interest of W.Bro.J.E.Green sadly affected Kidderminster Masonry for he also took the Chair of Hope & Charity Chapter in 1896 and failed to keep the Chapter working; consequently the Chapter closed down until it was resuscitated in 1899.
