HISTORY 1798-1899

In the summer of 1798, Bro. William Burwood, P.M. and Treasurer, with other members of the United Mariners Lodge, now No. 30 on the roll of United Grand Lodge, but then No. 23 on that of the Grand Lodge of "Ancient" or "Atholl" Masons, established the "Institution for Clothing and Educating the sons of Indigent Freemasons", and a short time later six children were admitted to its benefits. In 1801 His Grace the Duke of Atholl, Grand Master, became its Patron, while a few years later his Grand Lodge took it under protection, generously voting from time to time considerable sums of money towards its support, and for the last eighteen months before its union with the "Modern" Grand Lodge it regularly contributed a certain proportion of the fees received for the initiation of candidates.

In 1809 it voted a sum of £210 to enable the Governors to commemora ethe Jubilee of George III's accession to the throne by increasing the number of children to 50, and the number was accordingly augmented to that figure the following year. In 1814, after the Union of the 'Ancient' and 'Modern' Grand Lodges had been accomplished, and all distinction between 'Ancient' and 'Modern' Freemasons had been effaced, the benefits of the Institution were extended to the children of all poor or deceased English Freemasons. In 1817 a similar Institution which had been established by Bro. F. Columbine Daniel and other members of the "Modern" Royal Maval Lodge of Independence, No. 57—now Royal Naval Lodge No. 59—was amalgamated with the earlier Chapter.

In 1832 His Majesty King William IV gracious'y consented to recome Patron, and the prefix "Royal" was inserted in the title of the Institution. At the same time the Duke of Sussex, Grand Master, accepted the office of President, and the rank, it first hor orary, of Vice-President was instituted. Her Majesty Queen Victoria became Patron of the Institution in 1832 and at the time of her death in 1901 she was the oldest annual subscriber. Other Royal Patrons have been Their Majesties King Edward VII, King George V, King Edward VIII and King George VI. Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II is also a Patron of the Institution.

In 1848 the Institution entered upon a career of increased activity. What resulted from the Jubilee Festival there are no means of ascertaining, but we may assume that it was a success, as later in the same year a committee was appointed to inquire in what direction the usefulness of the Charity could be extended. In 1849 the recommendations of this committee were acted upon, and the scheme of education enlarged. The following year, low ever, a second committee of inquiry was appointed, and the education still further improved, while greater assistance was rendered to the parents or guardians of the children in the matter of clothing.

Up to this time the beneate of the Institution took the form of assisting sons of Freemasons with grants for clothing, books, e.c., and it was specifically provided that they should be "put to the nearest school to which they reside" (the cost being borne by the Institution) and that they should be taught "reading withing and with netic". In 1852, however, the Governors and Subscribers determined, in order that he original intentions of the founders should be carried out in their entirety, a building fund should be raised, and in four years a sufficient sum was obtained to allow of Lordship House, Wood Green Tottenham, and the grounds—about ten acres—in which it stood being purchased for the sum of £3,500. In 1857, the house having in the meantime been adapted to the purposes of a boarding whool, 25 of the boys were received into the school, and placed in charge of the Rev. C. Woodward, as Master. The success of the experiment was such, that the year following the whole of the 70 children—with the exception of two, whose parents elected to retain them under the old system—were placed in Bro. Woodward's charge. But the scheme of extension having been once entered upon was continued with unabated vigour.

In 1861 Bro. Frederick Binckes was appointed Secretary, and under his auspices the annual Festivals on behalf of the Institution proved so remarkably successful that it was resolved to erect on the same site a new and larger school, which would be capable of accommodating at least 100 boys. The first stone of the new building was laid with Masonic formalities by Bro. Algernon Perkins, Past Grand Warden of England, in 1863, and in 1865 the premises were inaugurated by the Deputy Grand Masier, Bro. Earl De Grey and Ripon. In 1866 a gymnasium and library were established, and "Speech Livinstituted. In 1869 and 1870 the mortgage of £10,000 which had been raised on the property, in order to enable the Governors to carry out their plans the more speedily and efficaciously, was paid of. This was followed by a period of further inquiry, the result of which was an increase in the purpher of boys in 1874 to 153, and further improvements in the educational curriculum. In 1875 Bro. Dr. Richard Morris was appointed Headmaster, and two years later the premises were enlarged by the purchase of Kent House as an Infirmary and the extension of the school buildings, so as to clover a additional 32 boys to be admitted.

In 1883 the Festival produced the exceptionally large sum of £23,000, which enabled the committee to proceed at once with their scheme for erecting a preparatory school. A block of four houses adjoining the Institution was accordingly purchased, and the work of erecting a new hall, are according the newly acquired property to its intended purpose, proceeded rapidly. In 1805 the Memorial Stone of the Hall was laid by the Baroness Burdett-Courts. The additional property thus made available enabled the authorities to increase the number of pupils by 50 to 235 in all.

In 1888 a strong committee was appointed to inquire into and report upon the affairs of the Institution, and in 1890 the recommendations of the committee were accorded by the General Court of Governors and Subscribers. The principal change was the substitution of a Board of Management of thirty Life-Governors for the old House and Audit Committees; and a revised curriculum was adopted, which for the first time included various branches of committees.

The growth of the school in numbers considered to the remarkable, and admirable as the buildings were in many respects they were never interded for the large a number. Playing fields had to be acquired at a considerable distance from the school, involving a serious loss of time. Additions to the premises also had to be made in the form of a sounce lecture hall, class rooms, swimming baths, etc. Accordingly the Board of Management (acting on the suggestion made by the Earl of Lathom, Provincial Grand Master, West Lancashire, at the 1891 respival) asked that the Quarterly Court should give them powers to dispose of the existing premises, and eact a new school elsewhere.

The powers were given to the Board by the Quarterly Court in April, 1896, and the purchase of a new site of 67 acres at Busney, Hertford shire, for the erection of a new school was subsequently approved.

In 1896 a successful appeal to the Craft resulted in the formation of a "Scholarship Fund" for the higher education and training of ex-pupils. This Fund is still in active existence and is managed by a Board of Covernors quite separate from the management of the Institution. The first scholarship founded was intitled "The Grand Lodge Scholarship", of the value of £35 per annum (increased in 1930 to £70 per annum). Since that date six other scholarships have been founded.

The Centenary of the Institution was celebrated in June, 1898 under most distinguished auspices. H.R.H. the Princess of Wales (later Queen Alexandra) most graciously attended at the Royal Albert Hall and presented the prizes to the boys on Tuesday, June 7th, when over 5,000 ladies and brethren attended. On the following Friday, in the same hall, the 3,820 stewards dined under the Presidency of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales, Grand Master, supported by many Provincial and District Grand Masters and by hundreds of Grand Officers. The record subscription of £134,000 then announced was subsequently increased to over £141,000.

HISTORY FROM 1900 ONWARDS

The foundation stone of the new school buildings at Bushey was laid with Masonic ceremonial on May 12th, 1900, by H.R.H. the Duke of Connaught, acting for the Grand Master, in the presence of about 1,500 visitors.

The buildings, designed in a plain scholastic style, mainly fifteenth century in character, were completed in October, 1902. The boys entered the new school in January, 1903, on their return at the usual time after the Christmas vacation, and in June, 1903, the sale of the former conditions at Wood Green was completed.

In 1906 the age limit for election to the benefits of the Institution was raised from elever to twelve years, to fourteen in 1914, to sixteen in 1937, and to eighteen in 1966. In 1943 the agrae which petitions could be received was reduced from five to four years.

In 1922 the Masonic Boys Welfare Fund was established for the ourpose of providing benefits for boys who had received their education either in the school at Pisher or by means of grants made by the Board of Management. This Fund is still in existence and continues to do a great deal of quiet and unostentatious work in assisting ex-pupils to establish themselves in their chosen careers at a time when their earned income is usually very small. Its resources are limited, however, and any donations which may be made to enable the Fund to continue it good work will be gratefully received by the Secretary.

Owing to the rapid increase in the number of toys receiving the benefits of the Institution, the Quarterly Court of October 10th, 1919, unan mously resolved to purchase the Manor Estate, Bushey, consisting of over 52 acres, for the purpose of execting a Junior School when practicable, and when an adequate building fund had been raised.

Through the generosity of the Craft it was soon found possible to proceed with the scheme and on June 8th, 1926, H.R.H. the Dube of Connaught aid the foundation stone of the new Junior School. 400 boys were admitted in January, 1.29.

In 1925 and 1936 further purchases of and were made totalling in all 292 acres in order to protect the amenities of the schools. Small parcels of this land have since been sold at various times under development schemes, but not in any way to the detriment of the schools.

Following a petitical presented by authority of the Quarterly Court of October 9th, 1925, a Charter of Incorporation was granted to the Institution by His Majesty King George V, Patron of the Institution, on Jone 15th, 1926. A Supplemental Charter amending the previous Charter in certain respects was granted by He. Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on 22nd May, 1958. A second Supplemental Charter was granted this year which further amended the two previous Charters in matters of detail most of which are designed to facilitate closer co-operation between the Board of Management and the Go erning Body of the Schools (which had been brought into being by the first Supplemental Charter).

A complete Table of Festivals from 1900 onwards will be found on pages 11 and 12. The record total of £667,464 was set up at the 1952 Festival held under the Chairmanship of the Provincial Grand Master, West Lancashire (R.W.Bro. A. Foster); this is followed by the 1964 total of £629,350 set up under the Chairmanship of R.W.Bro. Rt. Hon. the Earl of Warwick, D.L., J.P., Treasurer of the Institution, with the special, though by no means exclusive, support of London Lodges.

PRESENT ARRANGEMENTS

Today the administration of the Institution as a whole is vested in the Court which usually meets once a year and is composed of representatives elected by Provinces and Districts and by London Lodges. The more detailed management of Institution affairs, however, is delegated under the Court as a Board of Management which holds four regular meetings annually and is itself composed of representatives elected by the Court as under:

The Senior School is a Headmasters' Conference School, and thus ranks with the best known independent boarding schools in the country. The Junior School, as a member of the Incorporated Association of Preparatory Schools, ranks with the best schools of its type in the country. Their aim is to provide a liberal education in a friendly, homely atmosphere for boys elected to benefits who might otherwise have been deprived, by the death or distress of a parent, of an education suited to their special needs.

The schools stand in their own magnificent grounds to the north-west of Bushey. The Senior School estate comprises some 80 acres and the Junior School estate some 52 acres, part of the larger Masonic estate of 250 acres. The Senior School is entirely self-contained, and the buildings include a Chapel, assembly hall, nine boarding houses, a central dining hall, gymnasium, word orly shop, metal-work shop, printing shop, music school, indoor swimming bath, a running trace work fine receipt and cricket fields, fives courts, hard tennis courts, infirmary, laundry and maintenance workshops, including a shoe repair shop. It has an academic staff of 38 (plus 4 part-time music tuers). Maintenance men, groundsmen and porters total 41; there is a domestic staff of 56 (plus 16 doily women) and ever resident State Registered Nurses. The Junior School is also self-contained and 125 an assembly and and seven boarding houses, a gymnasium, art and handicraft rooms, music rooms, an outdoor wimming bath, excellent playing fields, hard tennis courts, infirmary, a central dining hall, well equipped kitchens, a modern laundry and maintenance workshops, including a shoe spair shop. The academic staff totals 21; a domestic staff of 51 (plus 14 daily women) and two resident State Regis ered Nurses.

There are at present approximately 600 boys at Bush v and every year about 100 new boys are admitted. They are of all types and standards of attainment; but one thing they almost all have in common—they have lost their fathers. Boys may onte, the school at any time between the ages of nine and fourteen, subject to an entrance test disjoin to assess their capability to benefit from the school curriculum. The move from the Junion to the Senior School is made at the age of thirteen. There is no 11-plus examination. The schools are comments we in the sense that provision is made for boys of all educational attainments who might otherwish be divided between Grammar, Secondary, Technical and Secondary Modern Schools.

It is our aim to make the schools as homely as possible and to do our best to replace the help and guidance of the lost parent. Careful attention is paid to health and physical well-being. All the boys are supplied with every item of clothing equired, all school books and materials; they have all examination fees defrayed and their fares poid to their homes for the holidays; and, if their surviving parents or guardians cannot meet their requirements out of their own resources, they receive a holiday allowance. Catering is designed to provide an appetising, nourishing and scientifically balanced diet. The health of the boys is cared for the by ensuring a healthy and regular routine with regular physical inspection and supervision and by the pompt treatment of all ailments by fully qualified medical staffs in the schools' cynexicallent's equipped sanatoria. The school doctors attend daily; specialists are called in when necessary and treatment is carried out by fully qualified resident nursing staffs. Extra nurses are obtained when a quired. Eyes are regularly tested by a consultative occulist and dental treatment is a ailable.

Toy, are encouraged to be self-reliant and confident in their ability, and to realise that life is not a matter of receiving ally, but that each has to make some contribution to the life of the community. Boarding schools such as the Royal Masonic Schools can bring home to boys the various aspects and characters of community life. Just to live there is some training in character for them, especially when they find themselves cheek by jowl with boys from all parts of the country. Each boy is given some responsibility as soon as he is able to shoulder it. In the Senior School boarding houses the discipline is largely in the hands of the prefects who have been brought up to accept this responsibility. Another sphere in which responsibility and leadership are presented to the boy is in the Cadet Corps. This

is acknowledged to be one of the best in the country. It has been inspected by Field Marshal the Duke of Gloucester and provided a Guard of Honour for another Field Marshal, Lord Wilson, when he was installed as Constable of the Tower.

A wide variety of hobbies is encouraged: philately, drawing and painting, carpentry, metalwork, photography, model aeroplane construction, dramatics, book-binding and printing.

In 1957 a leadership course for selected boys of the 16/17 age group was instituted. The school now strongly supports the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme and the courses for this are held annually in Cornwall. A number of Gold Awards have already been obtained and the burs concerned presented with these at St. James's Palace.

At the heart of the Senior School is the Chapel. Here, and in the Junior School, Church Cervices sufficiently varied to suit all shades of opinion are conducted by the Chapiain. Once a year a Confirmation Service is held when boys are presented, with their parents' consent, to the Pishop of St. Albans or his Suffragan. Divinity lessons are of non-denominational character.

In the winter term the Junior School plays Association, the Senior School, Rugby Union, football. In the spring term both play hockey and in the summer, cricket. An ong the minor sports are swimming, athletics, fives, tennis and basket ball. Matches are played against neighbouring schools. Music flourishes. The Senior School has its own orchestra and military band. A play is given once a year. There are also many school clubs covering a variety of interests.

Election to a place at Bushey secures a boy's education up to the age of 16. At that age or before boys may take the General Certificate of Education of Ordinary Level. Those who show themselves fitted to benefit from an advanced course remain to the age of 18 or 19.

When these boys go out into the wor'd — bout 100 of them every year — it is the responsibility of the Royal Masonic Institution for Poys to ensure the for every one of them a position is found suitable to his capacity, for he has no father to do this tor him. The most academically gifted of them will have already won a place at a University, some with scholarships or others with grants. Others become doctors, dentists, teachers, scientists, civil servants, or enter the Navy, Army, Air Force and Mercantile Marine. A Careers Mix ter at the senior School in co-operation with the Public Schools' Appointments Bureau, steers the boy's thoughts and ambitions during his last year at school, and, in most cases, finds him his first apprenticesnip or appointment. A watchful eye, often with the help of a local Lodge, is kept on a boy for his first year or so, to make sure that the choice of career was the right one, and a monetary trans from the lunds of the Institution is frequently made to supplement initial earnings.

It is the task of the Institution to see that the boys committed to their charge have at least as good a change in life as they would have had if their fathers had lived. That this task is being well performed is shown by the impressive academic successes obtained and the distinctions achieved by old boys in all wilks of line. Amongst contemporary Old Masonians may be numbered Ambassadors, Governors of Previnces, senior military officers, and distinguished members of the Civil Service, legal, medical, and other professions. Some 1,458 Old Boys served in the Forces during the war, a large proportion of whom held commissions.

In 1963 the Court gave its approval to a re-building programme mainly at the Senior School. This programme which is now gathering increased momentum will cost well over half a million pounds in the course of the next few years, at the end of which the school will undoubtedly be amongst the best equipped in this country.

In addition to the boys educated at the Royal Masonic Schools under the supervision of the Governing Body, the Board of Management is at present immediately responsible for over 200 other boys in respect of whom it is for various reasons considered more appropriate that they should receive their education elsewhere.

The Board takes great care that such boys receive their education only at properly recognised schools and regular reports are received as to their progress both at work and at play. Since it was first founded many thousands of boys have owed their good start in his to the help given to them by the Institution, and although there have been many Levelor and in the field of education the Institution continues to serve a very real purpose in opening up to the sorts of our deceased and distressed Brethren opportunities which would otherwise by devied them.

As has already been pointed out, Old Masonians, as well as those educated by the Craft outside the Royal Masonic Schools, have filled distinguished posts in all walks of life and evidence of the regard in which the schools are held is to be found in a virile Old Masonians. Association. There are also five Lodges composed entirely of Old Masonians where interest in and love for the school remains unabated by the passing of the years. All this work cannot be done, however, without the financial support of the Craft. The present annual running costs of the Institution are approximately £400,000 a year and due to general inflationary pressures this cost is continually rising. As against this the Institution has a guaranteed annual income of approximately £100,000 so that the need for continued financial support to assist the sons of our deceased and less fortunate Brethren is constant and pressing. With the additional heavy responsibility for the rebuilding programme at the schools it is probably true to say that the financial needs of the Institution have never been so great as they are at the present time.
