**GENERAL** 

The Senior School is a Headmasters' Conference School, admitting boys at the age of thirteen. It prepares them, in the first instance, for the General Certificate of Education "O" Level, the Certificate of Secondary Education or London Chamber of Commerce (Elementary) Examinations. When a overeaches the age of sixteen, he either leaves or, on the recommendation of the Governing Body, he is retained for a further period, subject to satisfactory progress, conduct and influence. For such retained boys, the full range of arts and science courses in the Sixth Form are designed to lead to G.C.E. "A" Level, Services Entrance Examinations, and University Entrance.

The Junior School is a member of the Incorporated Association of Preparatory Schools, admitting boys at the age of nine. All boys proceed from it to the Senior School at thirteen plus. Those who are academically fitted take the Public Schools Common Entrance Examination in their last term at the School. Because the Schools cater for a very wide range of academic ability, teaching groups have to be kept small. The result is that they receive much more personal attention than they would in classes of the normal size.

The uniform provided by the School consists of blazer and flannels for every-day wear and, for best, a sun.

The School Year consists of three terms of twelve weeks, four weeks holiday at Christmas, four weeks at Easter and eight weeks in the summer. Cost of travel between hone and Bushey is net by the School.

Entry to the Schools is cont olled by the Board of Management, Royal Masonic Institution to Boys, under the terms of a Royal Charter, and correspondence on this sucject should be addressed to The Secretary, The Royal Masonic Institution for Boys, 26 Great Queen Street, London, W.C.2.

SITUATION AND BUILDINGS The two Schools share an estate of approximately 150 acres which provide ample from for games. The boys live in Houses about 48-strong, each under a Housemaster, an Assistant Housemaster and a House Matron. The Houses in cluce dormitories, day rooms and studies. Each School has a Dining Hall for central feeding. Each School has a sanatorium with two State Registered Nurses under the supervision of a School Medical Officer who visits daily.

A building programme has recently been completed costing nearly one million pounds, the major part of which is the provision of a completely new science block, workshop block and improvement of boys' accommodation at the Senior School. Certain minor improvements have also been made at the Junior School.

RELIGION

The Schools are non-denominational and special arrangements within the Schools' routine can be made for Roman Catholics and Jews if their parents

so desire. Each School has its own Church of England Chaplain who conducts services of a broad Church of England type and is responsible for the teaching of scripture. Boys can be prepared for Confirmation and a Confirmation Service is held in the Senior School Chapel annually.

GAMES AND SPORTS At the Senior School the main games are Rugby Football, Flocke, and Cricket; at the Junior School, Association Football is played instead of Rugby. The Schools enjoy a good record in matches with other schools. At the Junior School there is an open-air swimming bath and an and or teaching pools and boys learn to swim before they pass to the Senior School. At the Senior School there is an indoor heated bath in use all the war round. Each School has its own gymnasium and tennis courts. The senior School has a very fine athletics track and sports arena and some Rugby Nives courts.

Each School has its own Director of Music with assistants working under him. A boy may learn any recognised individual incount and he may have the opportunity of corporate musical activities as well. The instruction given results in the Senior School in a symphory orclestra, a military band, a choral society and a Chapel cloir. Each School produces its own play every year. At the Junior School there is a Cub Pack which boys may join. At the Senior School they join the School contagent of the Army Cadet Force which is the 1st Cadet Baltalion of an London Rifle Brigade (The Rifle Brigade). The art rooms and workshope (wood, metal, pottery and printing) in each School are available to boys in their spare time for voluntary work. The Junior School has a Molel Railway Club; both Schools have photographic and ligrary clubs. At the Senior School, selected boys are encouraged to undertake training in the Ouke of Edinburgh Silver and Gold Awards which require a tendance at a Spring Camp for the Silver Award and a December Camp for the Cold Award, in addition to the annual Cadet Camp.

LEAVING

During a boy's last year at School, he is advised in his choice of career by a pecial Careers Master. He will advise the boy of suitable openings and arrange interviews with prospective employers. When a boy leaves, he is enabled to purchase a full set of clothes. There is a strong Old Masonians' Association which every boy is encouraged to join. This meets at the School three times a year. If, at the age of twenty-one, an ex-pupil desires to become a Freemason, there are several Old Boys' Lodges in various parts of the country, one of which might be a suitable choice for him.










