
INAUGURATION FESTIVAL

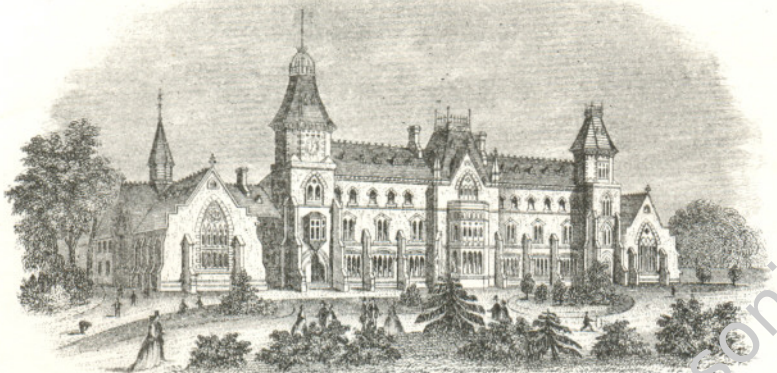
