
**LABOUR OF THE LODGE.**

Brethren Visiting Lodges Overseas.

The Board (of General Purposes) hopes that every Brother who wishes to visit a Lodge under a recognised Constitution while abroad will obtain from his Lodge Secretary a Certificate stating that he is in good financial standing with the Lodge at the time of his visit. This, as well as his Grand Lodge Certificate, can then be produced when called upon to do so.

Brethren should not make any Masonic contacts overseas with Masons of other Jurisdictions without having ascertained, by application to the Grand Secretary at Freemasons' Hall, the existence of regular Masonry in the country concerned, and the address to which Masonic enquiries in that country should be directed.
