## CONSECRATION.

- 1. Bro. F. J. Brutord, J. W. unveils Banner and hands it to the Rt. Wor. Provincial Grand Master.
- 2. The Consecrating Officer (The Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master) addresses the Worshipful Master and asks his acceptance of the Banner in the name of the Lodge.
- 3. The Worshipful Master rises and replies. He then accepts the Banner and asks the Chaplain to dedicate it whereupon the Worshipful Master resumes his seat.
- 4. The Chaplain recites a Prayer of Dedication.
- 5. Chant (Omnes): "So mote it be."
- 6. The Consecrating Officer (the Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master) will then give an address on the Banner and its intention.

- 7. The Consecrating Chaplain will explain its meaning and the lessons that should be learned from it.
- 8. Musical Response: "Glory be to Thee, O God."
- 9. The following Anthem will be sung:

Behold how good and joyful a thing it is Brethren to dwell together in unity It is like the precious ointment upon the head, the ran down into the beard, even unto Aaron's beard and went down to the skirts of his clothing, It is like the dew of Herman, which fell upon the Hill of Zion; for there the Lord promised dis blessing, and life for evermore.

- 10. The Worshipful Master takes the Banner from the Provincial Grand Director of Geremonies and places it in its stand behind the Chair, he turns it towards the Lodge, resumes his place and says.
- 11. "Brethren for all the blessings and mercies vouch-safed to us by the Great Architect of the Universe, let us praise and growing His Holy Name."
- 12. Musical response: "Glory be to God on High."
- 13. A. the Brenhren sing the following: Old Hundredth.

Onest Architect, to Thee we raise
With joy our grateful songs of praise:
"Our Brothers" neath this Banner bless,
And crown their labours with success.

May peace be with us evermore, And love extend from shore to shore; May we in harmony combine, And let, O Lord, the praise be Thine.
