PRAYER by the PROVINCIAL GRAND CHAPLAIN: - Al aighty and Eternal God, Great Architect of the Universe, Who dist from Thy Throne behold all dwellers upon Earth, Lirect us in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and turther us with Thy continual help, that in all our works begun, continued, and en led in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name. The P. sident W. Bro. Alerman Sir FREDERICK SMITH, J.P., P.P.G.W., will depute Dr. DAVID R ROWLANDS, Senior Honorary Physician to request the R.W. Provincial Gast d Master to perform the Ceremony of Laying the Foundation Stone.

he R.W. PROVINCE IL GRAND MASTER will direct the Stone to be raised.

The R.V. PROVINCIAL GRAND MASTER will address the assembly :---"Men and Brethren here assembled to-day to behold this Ceremony, know all of y w that we be lawful Masons, true and faithful to the laws of our Country and established of old with peace and honour, in most countries, and engaged by solemn obligations to erect magnificent buildings to be serviceable to the Brethren, and to fear God the Great Architect of the Universe.

We have amongst us, concealed from the eyes of all men, secrets which cannot be divulged, but these secrets are lawful and honourable, and not repugnant to the laws of God or man. They were entrusted in peace and honour to Masons of antient times, and have been faithfully transmitted to us, and it is our duty to convey them unimpaired to the latest posterity. Unless our Craft were good, and our calling honourable, we should not have lasted for so many centuries, nor should we have been honoured with the patronage of so many illustrious men of all ages, who have shown themselves ready to promote our interests, and to defend us against all adversaries.

We are assembled here to-day, in the presence of you all, to assist in laying the Foundation Stone of this Hospital, which we pray God may deserve to prosper as a place of Healing the Sick and for the promotion of true Godliness, Harmony, and Brotherly Love, throughout the World, until time shall be no more."

The R.W. PROVINCIAL GRAND MASTER will pass to the Stone and take up his position.

- The R.W.PROVINCIAL GRAND MASTER will ask the Prov. Grand Secretary to read the Inscription on the Stone.
- The Asstistant Prov. GRAND SECRETARY will hand the Trowel Architect.
- The ARCHITECT will present the Trowel to the R.W. I ROV. GRAND M. STER.
- The Cement will be laid on the lower Stone and the Provincial Grand Master will adjust the same with a Trowel presented to him.
- The Foundation Stone will be lowered by three district movements and will be adjusted by the Builder.
- The ASSISTANT PROV. GRANT MUSTER will present the Maul to the R.W. PROV.GRAND M SI." who will adjust the Stone on its bed by striking the four corners with the Heavy Maul, saying : "With Temperance, Fo thude, Prude ce, and Justice, let our work be founded."
- The R.W. PROV. GRAND MASTER: "Bro. Junior Warden, you will apply the Plumb Rule to the Stone.
- The J.W. thaving dor so). -- "R.W. Brother, I find the Stone perfect and these worthy, "the Craftsmen have done their duty."
- The ?.W. PROV. GRAND MASTER :-- "Bro. Senior Warden, you will apply the Level to prove the Stone."
- The S.W. (having done so) :--"R.W. Brother, I find the Stone to be well for ded. The Craftsmen have done their duty."
- The R.W. PROV. GRAND MASTER :-- "Bro. Dep. Prov. Grand Master, you will apply the Square to prove the Stone."
- The DEP. PROV. GRAND MASTER :-- "R.W. Brother, I have applied the Square and find the Stone to be true. The Craftsmen have done their duty."
- The Asst. Prov. GRAND MASTER will present the Maul to the R.W, PROV. GRAND MASTER.

- The R.W. PROV. GRAND MASTER :- "Having full confidence in your skill in the Royal Art, it now remains with me to complete the Work." (Strikes the Stone three times with the Maul). "By the power in me vested and in the name of the Great Architect of the Universe, I declare this Stone well and truly laid in accordance with the Ancient Rule of Architecture."
- The PROV. GRAND SUPERINTENDENT OF WORKS (presenting the Plans) says :--"R.W. Brother, deign to inspect and sanction the whole design."
- R.W. PROV. GRAND MASTER :- "I will do so with pleasure." (inspects the plans and hands them back) "With the implements of our Craft and these instructions, may there be raised a superstructure, perfect in its parts and honourable to the builders."
- The BRETHREN will turn towards the East, while the R.W. P. ov. GRAND MASTER delivers the Invocation.
- The CONSECRATING VESSELS are presented successively to GRAND MASTER.
- The CHAPLAIN RECITES :- "There shall be an bondful of Com in the Earth upon the top of the Mountains; the fruit thereo, shall shake like Lebanon; and they of the City s'all flourish like grass of the Earth." Ps Vm LXXII. v. 16.

And may the Almighty Architect of the Universito look down with benignity upon our present undertaking, and crewn this edifice with His blessing.

GRAND CHAPLAIN :--- "Blessed be Thy Name, O Lord God, for that it hath pleased Thee to have Thy habitation among the sons of men upon earth, and to dwell in the midst of their assemblies. Bless, we beseech Thee, the work we have this day begun in Thy name. May the Edifice about to be erected on this foundation stone be completed to Thy Honour and Glory, and may those who shall hereafter use the building, dedicate and devote their lives to Thy service, and evermore praise and magnify Thy Holy Name."
