LODGE MEETINGS

- 1939. The Meeting in September was cancelled.
- 1940. Meetings were held in March, April, June, September and October.
- 1941. Meetings were held in March, April, June, September and October. As the large majority of the Brethren lived many miles from Chertsey and war-time conditions and restrictions made it difficult for them to attend Meetings of the Lodge except in ing the summer months, it was resolved at the Meeting held on 18th October, 1941, after a full discussion, that Meetings in 1942 should be held on 25th April, 30th May, 27th June, 25th July and 19th September at such hours as the W.M. may determine; that the Bye-Laws be suspended accordingly; and that a copy of the Resolution be forwarded to all Members of the Lodge, and to such higher authorities as may be required.
- 1942. Meetings were field in April May and June.
- 1943. Meetings were held in March, May, June, July and September.
- 1944. Meetings were beid in March, April and October.
- 1945. Meetings were seld in March, April, June, September and October.

ATTENDANCES

In round figures the average number of Brethren—excluding visitors—attending Lodge Meetings during the war years was reduced. This was almost entirely due to difficulties of travel. The figures hereunder include for purposes of comparison those relating to the years 1938 and 1946.

LODGE PREMISES

During the day the dining room was used for many months for teaching purposes by the Educational Authority. School meals continued to be served in the dining from until a much later date.

Bombs were dropped within half a mile for the Masonic Hall but no structural damage occurred. There were no losses of Lodge property or Records as the result of enemy action.
