

Wernlegh Abbey Lodge

Historical Notes 1946-1977

Formation of the Lodge

Several Brethren belonging to the ancient Order of Free and Accepted Masons, feeling anxious that a new Lodge should be established caused the necessary petition to be prepared and signed, as required by the Book of Constitutions under the sanction of the Worshipful Master and Wardens of the Halas Abbey Lodge No. 5407, and the same was forwarded to the Right Worshipful Brother General Sir Francis Davies & C.B., K.C.M.G., K.C.V.O., V.L., Provincial Grand Master for the Province of Wo cestershire who obtained the necessary Warrant or Charter from the G. and Le dge of England.

The petition read as follows:

"To the Most Worshipful Grand Master of the United Fraternity of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of England.

We the undersigned being regularly registered Master Masons of the Lodges mertioned against our respective names, having the prosperity of the Craft at heart, are anxious to exert our best endeavours to promote and diffuse the genuine principles of the art: and, for the conveniency of our respective dwellings and other good reasons we are desirous of forming a new Lodge to be named Wernlegh Abbey Lodge.

In consequence of this desire, we pray for a Warrant of Constitution empowering us to meet as a regular Lodge at the Masonic Hall, Newfield, Halesowen, Worcestershire, on the fourth Yuesday of September, October, November, December, January, February, March, April and May and there to discharge the duties of Masonry in a constitutional manner, according to the forms of the Order and the laws of the Grand Lodge; and we have nominated and do recommend Brother Samuel Henry Davis who has served the Office of Warden in a regular Lodge to be the first Master, Brother Cecil Siviter to be the first Senior Warden and Brother Frank Latham to be the first Junior Warden of the said Lodge. The prayer of this petition being granted, we promise strict obedience to the commands of the Grand Master and the laws and regulations of Grand Lodge.

The Consecration

The consecration of the Lodge took place at Halesowen on Saturday 23rd November, 1946 before "a most distinguished gathering" which included 5 grand officers, 29 provincial grand officers and 59 other brethren, in addition to the founders, in the absence of the Provincial Grand Master The Right Worshipful Brother General Sir Francis Davies, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., K.C.V.O., V.L., Deputy Grand Master, the Cons.c ation Ceremony was carried out by the Deputy Provincial Grand Master the Wersnipful Brother Alfred Allen P.G.D. The History of the Connection of Wernlegh Abbey with Halas Abbey

The following details are summarised from the Doomsday Book: Robert de Somerie, in 1292, died seised of the Manor of Wornlegh in the County of Worcester, then held by William de Fokenham by service of one Kni ht's fee, valued at £6. 17. 8d. per annum. In 1308 Sir William Foke nam in/er teo from his father the Manor of Wernlegh with all his lands and tenement, in Wernlegh, Ruggacre, Cakemore, Langley and Wallaxhall, with the Chantry of Beendhall, belonging to the Chapel of St. Katherine.

The Chapel of St. Katherine at the east end of the north aisie of Hales Owen Parish Church, is generally called the Warley Changel

In 1321 the last of the Someries died and his lands being divided between his two sisters, Margaret, the wife of John de Latter, had for her share Dudley Castle, many Staffordshire Manors and the town of Dudley

Her sister, Joan, the wife of John de Bot tot, had the other moiety of the estates including the Manors of North field and Walley.

In 1328 a licence in Morth ain was granted to enable Joan Botetort to bestow the Manor of Werneleye upon the Abbot and Convent of Hales Owen. Twenty shillings of the rents arising from the Manor were to be distributed to the poor every year at the Abbey gate. In return for this bounty, prayers were forever to be said for the health of the soul of Lady Joan.

It is most interesting to note that within a period of 36 years -1292-1328 there is such a wide variation of the spelling of Wernlegh.

Lockge Banner

The Lodge Banner illustrates alms being distributed by the monks to the poor from the Abbey gates. The Provincial Grand Chaplain, W.Bro. E.H. Downey during the dedication ceremony elaborated on the design chosen by the Founders.

"The beautiful design depicts that virtue which can be said to be a characteristic of every Freemasons heart – charity. In the design a tribute has been paid to antiquity, to the charitable work long ago associated with the Abbey from which the Lodge had taken its name.

It might therefore be well to bear in mind that the monks of old realised the necessity of careful organisation to promote such characteristics. The Banner will be a perpetual reminder and a challenge to the Brethren to act conformably with the sentiment enshrined in it."

W.Bro. Downey concluded his address by saying:

"May this Banner never be sullied, may it forever inspire those who look upon it to true Masonic charity, and may the donor and all who range under it, ever find peace and blessing."

Founders' Rules

The Founders' Rules were drawn up prior to the Lodge Consecration but were formally ratified:-

"At the meeting of Past Masters and Officers held on Monday 3rd March. 1947, W.Bro. H.G. Pinner proposed and W.Bro. H. Hughes seconded that the following procedure be adopted."

Procedure re Candidates.

- 1. The Proposer must write to the W.M. naming the Candidate and the Seconder.
- 2. At next Officers' Meeting both the proposer and the Seconder must attend and report on Candidate. If the Officers approve the Candidate, the Secretary is instructed to write to the Candidate for the names and addresses of four referees (2 Masonic and 2 non-Masonic), and to write to the referees for their references.
- 3. At next Officers' viceting the references are reported and if all are satisfactory and opproved, two brethren are appointed to visit the Candidate as his nome. The Grand Lodge application forms are issued to the visiting Brethren for completion if they are satisfied at the end of their visit.
- 4. At next Officers' Meeting the visiting Brethren report and, if satisfactory, the Secretary is instructed to issue the Confidential Circular. Permission is also given for the Candidate to be proposed and seconded at the next Lodge.

The Candidate is ballotted for at the next meeting of the Lodge, one ball excludes.

 The Candidate is initiated at a subsequent Lodge. Under no circumstances shall a Candidate be ballotted for and initiated at the same Lodge meeting.

Procedure in Lodge

- 1. The Warrant of the Lodge shall be framed and exhibited in front of the Secretary's desk.
- 2. The V.S.L. shall be opened so that the W.M. can read it and the C...s shall be placed with the P...s towards the W.M. and cash's light.
- 3. The I.P.M. shall not salute the W.M. during the opening and closing when adjusting the C...s but shall bow to him.
- 4. The Lodge shall be squared on every occasion except where Emulation working directs otherwise.
- 5. All Brethren must stand while the Warrant is oping presented to the W.M. on Installation.
- 6. The D.C. shall join the Deccons with his vand during the reciting and sealing of the Obligation in all Decrees.
- 7. The P sign shall not be discharged until the Candidate has sealed the obligation.
- 8. The L... in the third Degree shall be extinguished before the T...s report is an ounced by the I.G. to the J.W. in accordance with ancient Emulation working as practised in British Lodge No. 8 and others.
 - The Lodge shall always be properly closed in the third and second Degrees and rever resumed unless it is the intention to re-resume in the original degree refore closing.
- 10. The D.C. or A.D.C. shall, on retiring, proceed round the Lodge room twice before the W.M. is escorted out. On the first occasion he shall be joined by the Deacons and on the second occasion by the Wardens.

Founders' Rules (continued)

Procedure in the Dining Room

- 1. The Wardens shall stand during all proposals of toasts and when the W.M. is standing, unless directed otherwise by the W.M. They shall not stand during responses except when the W.M. is the responder.
- 2. After taking wine with the W.M. following the Masters song the Watters shall return to their seats without turning their backs on the W.M.

Joining Members

Upon acceptance into the Lodge, joining members shall take precedence over all applicants for Initiation not initiated at that date.
