The Freemasons' Window.



The North Window of the North Transept was presented to the Cathedral by the Freemasons' of Worcestershire. It is of Early Decorated character and filled with stained glass by Lavers and Barraud.

The subject in the upper portion of the window is the Tw.lve Apostles, the bottom panels show the architects remarkable in the First and Second Temples and the tracery shows the symbols of Craft Masonry and Armorials of the Order.

Inscription. "To the glory of God and for the accomment of this Cathedral the North Transept Window is erected by the Freemasons' of Worcestershire-Albert Hudson Royds High Sheriff of the County. Provincial Grand Master A.D 1866".

Nov 27 Mr Royds having waited on the Dean and Chapter and having stated the wish of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Freemasons of Worcestershipe to erect a painted glass window in the large North Transept of this Oathedrak - The Dean Acts (Minutes) and Chapter expressed their gratitude for the madhicicent anation that was offered them and their ready willingness to accept it. When the design was placed before them they approved it generally both in regard to form and colour, but desire to make two suggestions in the way of enquir

1) Whether the border may not be improved

2) Whether the height of the figures which would be nearly 6 feet is not greater than desirable.

The Bennett Window.

By. LAVERS & BARRAUD. 1862.

A window erected to the memory of Joseph Bennett and filled with stained glass showing slender stylized figures in a very intense style. In the opinion of N.Pevsner, this is the best Victorian glass in the Cathedral.

The Left light shows the figure FIDES, Middle light shows the figure CARITAS, and the Right light shows the figure SPES.

Inscription: "Presented by the Freemasons' of Worcestershire in adornment of this Cathedral and in memory of their Frother Joseph Bennett P.Z.P.P.G.W. who was called to his rest of the 25th day o November 1862".
