Foreword to the By-Laws

St. Eadburgh, or using her Latin n.me, St. Echurgha, to whom the Parish Church of Yardley is dedicated, vas one of the numerous daughters of King Edward the Elder, the son of Alfred the Great.

Her father being desirous of arranging for her future, at the early age of three, caused to be placed before her the choice of a Prayer Book and Chalice on the one hand, and a bracelet and necklace on the other. The ching rasped eagerly the Prayer Book and Chalice, and this was interpreted as a sign of her dedication to the struce of God. She afterwards entered upon a religious life in the Convent or Winchester from which she was subsequently transferred to the Priory at Pershore, to which the Manor of Yardley belonged. There is a story of her humility worth preserving. It is said that when Abbess of Winchester, it was her custom to ... sh the socks of the Nuns while they were asleep, entering their cells noiselessly for that perpose.

During her life she obtained a great reputation for sanctity and on her quath, both Winchester and Pershore, coveted her remains. Mithough she was interred at Winchester, Pershore never heless managed to obtain some of her bones which were preserved till the Reformation as precious relics, and are reputed to have worked many miracles of healing.

This is practically all that is known of St. Edburgha, but that she was an actual person, and in her lifetime greatly esteemed for her piety, is proved by the fact that many churches are dedicated to her memory. It is only natural that a Lodge of Freemasons meeting in the parish with which she was in her lifetime associated, should wish to adopt her name and that an ancient tradition of piety and good works should thus be handed down to posterity.

Lodge History

IN presenting a record of the first twenty-five years' activities of the St. Edburgha Lodge, some account of the human element and the motives which actuated its formation should be of interest to present and future members and create in them a sense of pride in its successful progress.

The first Lodge to be founded in the Stechford district of the Masonic Province of Worcestershire, was Stechford Lodge, No. 3185, consecrated in 1906. Eighteen year later it became evident that a new Lodge would be of great advantage in order to give those brethren who had more recently become Members, an opportunity of progressing in Office. W. Pro James Lucking, a Founder and Past Master of Stechford noase, supported the suggestion that a daughter Doage be formed, and accordingly, seven Past Masters and the teen Junio. Brethren submitted a Petition to Grand Lodge, sponsored by Stechford Lodge, after receiving the concurrence and support of the R.W. Provincial Grand Master, General Sir Francis J. Davies. The Petition was favourably received by Grand Lodge, and the Warrant, dated February 6th, 1924, was garted.

St. Edburgha Lodge (the thing-hert active Lodge in the Province) was consecrated at Worker er Masonic Hall, on June 14th, 1924, the ceremony being conducted by the Prov. Grand Master, assisted by his Depuy, W. Bro. W. T. Page, **P.G.D.**, and the following Provincial Officers :--

Thus our newly consecrated Lodge commerced Masonic career in 1924, and it is pleasing to record in 1949 that there are now eight Craft Lodges meeting at Stechford, thereby emphasising the growth of Masonry in this district of the Province. In addition, there are ty o Poyal Arch Chapters, a Mark Lodge, and an Ark Mariners Lodge, meeting at the Stechford Masonic Hall.

We may here fittingly pay a tribute of respect and affection to those earnest and well leved Brethren who figured prominently in the work and development of the Lodge in its earlier years, and whose example of fracernal sincerity still remains :--

The following year by year record is intended to bear witness to the growth of the Lodge.

1924 In W. Bro. J. C. Gilbett's year of office, there were 14 Initiations, 10 Passings, 6 Raisings. 9 Joining Members were admitted. Three Emergency Meetings were held. The Lodge received an autograph letter from the M.W. the Grand Master, The Duke of Connaught, inviting the Lodge to participate in the Million Memorial Fund established for the purpose of erecting a Grand Temple in London, as a Peace Memorial to perpetuate the memory of those Brethren who fell in the 1914/18 War, and requesting the Lodge to send a Steward to the Festival on August 8th, 1925.

- 1925 W. Bro. R. Rees Fleeman, P.M. 3219 Notts., installed. Labour: 6 Initiations, 8 Passings, 9 Raisings, and Second Tracing Board. 2 Joining Members were admitted. Five Emergency Meetings were held.
 W. Bro. James Lucking, P.P.G.Supt.Wks., elected First Honorary Member.
- Bro. Henry Herbert Holland installed.
 Labour: 4 Initiations, 3 Passings, 3 Raisings, and Second Tracing Board. 2 Joining Members were admitted.
 On November 1st, 1926, it was unanimously resolved to qualify as a Hall Stone Lodge on the basis of the therpresent Membership, each Subscribing Member to donate Ten Guineas to the Million Memorial Fund.
- Bro. Arthur Bramley installed.
 Labour: 3 Initiations, 3 Passings, 4 R. sings, second Tracing Board, and 5th Section, 2nd Lecure.
 W. Bro. A. Millington, P.P.G.S vd.R., W. Bro. G. L. Bourne, P.A.G.D.C., and W. Brc. R. J. Taylor, P.P.G.D., were elected Honorary Members.
- 1928 Bro. Thomas Lea Elliot installed. Labour: 4 Initiations 5 Passings, 5 Raisings, and Second Tracing Board. One Emergency Meeting was held. During his Masters up, W. Dro. Enliott presented to the Lodge a silver chain to be worn on the collar of Office by all succeeding Masters.
- 1929 Bro. Charles Benson in telled. Labour 2 Initiations, 3 Passings, 4 Raisings, and First and Second Tracing Boards.

1930 Bro. Amos Folmes installed.

Labour : 3 Initiations, 2 Passings, 3 Raisings, and First Tracing Board. One Emergency Meeting was held.

931 Vro. William Robert Hunt installed.

Labour: 4 Initiations, 4 Passings, 2 Raisings, and 1st Section, 1 Lecture.

On June 30th, 1931, the Lodge, by completing the guarantee, qualified as a Hall Stone Lodge, and received the G.M.'s Hall Stone Jewel and Collarette, since worn by all Masters of the Lodge.

The Lodge Building Fund, for the eventual erection of a new Masonic Hall at Stechford, was inaugurated.

1932 Bro. Joseph Samuel Bruce installed. Labour: 3 Initiations, 3 Passings, 3 Raisings, and Second Tracing Board. One Emergency Meeting was held.

- 1933 W. Bro. Oliver Levick Bramley, P.M. 1431, installed. Labour: 3 Initiations, 4 Passings, and 5 Raisings. One Emergency Meeting was held.
- 1934W. Bro. Joseph Spruce Smith, P.M. 3708, installed. Labour: 3 Initiations, 3 Passings, 4 Raisings, and Second Tracing Board. An Emergency Meeting was held "to read, approve, and sign a Petition to the Royal Masonic Institution for Girls, in regard to the Daughter of a deceased Brother." The Petition was unanimously approved and the desired result achieved. The Provincial Grand Lodge Meeting at Worcesce. ch 30th October, 1935, was held under the Barners of Stechford Lodge, No. 3185, St. Edburgha codge, No. 4621, and the Lodge of Bon Accord, No. 4935. After the first ten years of existence, the active Membership of the Lodge was 57, with 4 Hor orary Mer. bers.
- 1935 W. Bro. Thomas Henry Baines, P. M. 4132, installed. Labour: 2 Initiations, 2 Passings, 2 Raisings, and First and Second Tracing Boards.
- 1936 Bro. Herbert Edwin Evars installed. Labour : 3 Initiations, . Passings, 2 Paisings, and Second Tracing Board. A resolution was pas ed on March 1st, 1937 " to join with other Lodges meeting at Stachierd, in forming a Group to be attached to the Worce tershire Associated Masonic Lodges."

1937 Bro. Will ed Bernard Heyes installed.

Labout: 2 Initiations, 2 Passings, 3 Raisings, and First and Second Traing Boards.

O. January 3rd, 1938, the Lodge sponsored a Petition for the formation of the Samaritan Lodge, No. 5728.

Bro. Edward Arnold Platts installed.

Labour 2 Initiations, 3 Passings, 1 Raising, and Second Tracing Board. One Emergency Meeting was held.

The 100th Regular Meeting was held on November 7th, 1.338.

Bro. Charles William Perry installed.

Labour: 2 Initiations, 1 Passing, 2 Raisings, and First Tracing Board.

Conditions resulting from the outbreak of War on September 3rd, 1939, necessitated a re-adjustment of dates and times of Meetings, but it is pleasing to record that the regularity of Meetings was not affected during the War period, although many difficulties and serious inconveniences were experienced. Light refreshment, or none at all, became customary, but Regular Masonic

activities continued in spite of transport difficulties, lighting restrictions, fuel shortages, air-raids, National Service demands, etc.

- 1940 Bro. Sidney Amphlet Matthews installed.Labour: 2 Initiations, 2 Passings, and 1 Raising. One Emergency Meeting was held.
- Bro. Charles Henry Hall installed.
 Labour: 2 Initiations, 1 Passing, and 2 Raisings.
 The Regular Meetings of the Lodge were, in accordance with Grand Lodge Emergency Regulations, altered to October, March, April, May, and June, and held accordingly.
 W. Bro. John C. Gilbett, P.P.G.W., a Founder and the first Master of the Lodge, was elected an Honorary Member.
- 1942 Bro. Frank Henry Roden installed. Labour: 3 Initiations, 4 Passings, 3 Kaisings. 1 Joining Member was admitted. One Emergency Meeting was held.
- 1943 Bro. George Roberts instal d. Labour: 3 Initiations, 2 Fassings, 3 Rusings, and Second Tracing Board. 1 Joiring Member vas admitted. One Emergency Meeting wis neld.

1944 Bro. Sydney Ogden installed.

Labour: 3 Initiations, 4 Parsings, and 3 Raisings. Two Emergency Meetings were held.

The Lodge approved and sponsored a Petition for the formation of a Royal Arch Chapter to bear its name and number

Al yough Second World War hostilities in Europe ended on May 8th, 1945, the Regular Lodge Meetings continued as during the War period, owing to fuel and transport restrictions

5 Bro. Clarence Thomas Fisher installed.

Labour: 2 Initiations, 3 Passings, 2 Raisings, and First and Second Tracing Boards. One Emergency Meeting was held.

1946 Bro. George Henry Burgess installed.

Labour: 3 Initiations, 2 Passings, 3 Raisings, and Second Tracing Board.

A Thanksgiving Service was held at Yardley Parish Church, to mark the successful end of the War, in which all Lodges meeting at Stechford participated.

During the Session the Regular Lodge Meetings were resumed in accordance with the By-Laws.

The St. Edburgha Lodge of Instruction was instituted, and the By-Laws approved by the Prov. G. Secretary, W. Bro. H. V. Stanton, **P.G.D.** W. Bro. W. B. Hayes, P.P.G.D., was elected Preceptor, and the first Meeting was held in June, 1947, when W. Bro. C. W. Perry, P.P.G.D., was elected Deputy Preceptor.

A Library of Masonic Literature has since been inaugurated in connection therewith.

The Provincial Grand Lodge Meeting was held at Dudley on September 13th, 1947, under the Banners of Group 8 of the Worcestershire Associated Masonic Lodges, viz. Stechford. 3185, St. Edburgha. 4621, Lodge of Bon Accord. 4935, Nautical Services. 5629, Samaritan 5729, and Yardley. 6324.

W. Bro. J. Spruce Smith, P.P.G.D., P.P.A.G.E (Warcks) was elected an Honorary Member.

The 150th Regular Meeting was held on February 3rd, 1947

1947 Bro. Sidney Morris installed.

Labour: 3 Initiations, 3 Passings, 2 Raisings, and First and Second Tracing Boards. Joining Member was admitted.

W. Bro. Thomas Lea Elliot, P.P.G.W., the Senior Past Master of the Lodge, was honoured with Grand Rank, and on 28th April, 197 was invested as Past Grand St.B. We are glad to record in this Brochure our great appreciation of this honour so worthly deserved by W. Bro. Elliott, for his long years of devoted service to Masonry in general, and the St. Eaburgha Lodge in particular. This appreciation was given tangible effect in the presentation to his Grand Lodge Regalia by the Brethren of the Lodge.

1948 Dro. James Arthur Hartnett installed.

Labour : 3 Litiations, 3 Passings, 3 Raisings, and Second Tracing Loard. 1 Joining Member was admitted.

1949 Bro. Robert Ernest Spittle installed.

The following is a summary of the Lodge's principal Charitable achievements in the course of its existence.

- Donations to Masonic Charitable Institutions and Masonic Hospital amount to £2,163 and 193 Stewardships have been served. In this connection we record with pleasure our appreciation of the work of W. Bro. T. H. Baines who was Almoner from 1924, until his death in 1939, and equally so of his successor, W. Bro. T. L. Elliott, who still zealously continues this most important work.
- Donations to the Worcestershire Provincial Benevolent Fund, War Relief Fund, Page Memorial Fund, Wocestershire Library and Museum Fund, and Iocal Charities, total £1,084.

3. The Contribution to the Million Memorial Fund was £488.

Remembering that Charity may justly be deemed the distinguishing characteristic of a Freemason's hear, it is natural to assume that the Lodge will maintain and n deed improve on its record.

It is also of interest to note that the Lodge holds 510 \pounds 1 Shares in the Stechford Masonic riall Company, and has in its Building Fund a further sum of £395, available for investment in the Fund to be used for the purpose of erecting and equipping the new Masonic rial.

Thes, briefly, we have recorded the progress of St. Ecburgha Looge over its 25 years of service to Freemasonry, We are conscious of the happy associations, the brotherly affections, and the warm-hearted co-operative efforts that have characterised these years, thereby stimulating the spirit and ideals of the Craft throughout all our activities.

These years represent the labours and sincerity of purpose of many brethren, some of whom have ceased labour and passed on. The fruits of those efforts remain with us and constitute the tone and spirit of our Lodge as it exists to-day. Undoubtedly we have inherited richly from the example of our predecessors, and we are proud and privileged to follow them.

May the G.A.O.T.U. bless our future labours.
