#### REPORT OF THE CHARITY AND BENEVOLENT COMMITTEE.

To be presented to the Provincial Grand Lodge at Stourbridge, under the Banner of the Stability" Lodge, No. 564, on Saturday, October 9th, 1926.

Your Committee herewith present their Forty-sixth Annual Report

The balance due and owing to the R.M.I. Boys at the last statement has been liquidated; for 15s. od. has been paid to the R.M. Benevolent Instrution; f84 (s. od. to the R.M.I. Girls; and f36 15s. od. to the R.M.I. Boys. There are, at be moment, 70 Subscribers to the Organisation.

The Province has one Male Annuitant receiving £6, o. o., per an iven from the R.M. Benevolent Institution. A Brother, late of the "Vernon" Lodge, No. 560, has been admitted to benefits at the last election. There are ten Female Annuitants; one has deceased since the last report, and one has been admitted to benefits at the last election for the "Lock were" Lodge, No. 1874. The total receipts of these twelve annuitants cost the Institution for os. od. per annum.

We have eight boys receiving berefit from the P.M.I. Boys. Two boys have been discharged, having reached the age of sixters since the last report; one boy from "Royal Standard" Lodge, No. 498, is now admitted to benefit. The cost of the Institution for educating our boys last year was £611 6s. 7d.

We have thirteen a ris receiving ber efits from the R.M.I. Girls. One has been discharged at the age limit since the last report, and one admitted from the "Arter" Lodge, No. 2654, at the last election. The cost to in Institution for educating our girls last year was £970.

Apologies were announced from the Provincial Grand Masters of Shropshire, Staffordshire, Herefordshire, and Hampshire and Isl of Wight; from the Deputy Provincial Grand Masters of Hampshire and Isle of Wight Shropshire, Glauce tershire, Warwickshire, Herefordshire, Staffordshire, S. Wales (E.D.); from the Assistant Provincial Grand Master of Warwickshire; the Grand Secretary (Sir Philip Colville Smith, M.A., V.O.); the Provincial Grand Secretaries of Warwickshire, Shropshire, and Mampshire and The of Wight; the Secretary of the Royal Masonic Institution for Boys, and a number of distinguished Brethren.

The Previn ial Grand Secretary lead his report, as follows:

The returns from the various Lodges, dated December 31st, 1923, shewed the membership to be 1,082. During the year there were 85 deaths and resignations and 157 new members, bringing the total to 1,754 at December, 1924. Allowance must be made for a number of Bre hre I whost names appear as members of more than one Lodge in the Province.

The R. W. Provincial Grand Master (accompanied by the Provincial Grand Secretary and many other Worcestershire Brethren) attended the Provincial Grand Lodge of Warwickshire, held in Birmingham on October 30th, when the Rt. W. Provincial Grand Master of Warwickshire (Col. W. F. WYLEY) accorded to him a most cordial welcome, and pledged the Brethren of Warwickshire to give their utmost support to the Royal Masonic Institution for Boys at the Festival to be held in 1925 under the presidency of our Provincial Grand Master.

Rt. W. Bro. Sir Francis Davies expressed his sincere thanks to the Warwickshire Brethren, and alluded in kindly terms to the specially fraternal relations which exist between the two sister provinces.

The W. Masters made brief statements concerning the work of their Lodges; the number of Brethren in attendance being declared as follows:

The audited accounts of the Provincial Grand Preasurer (W. Bio A. W. WATSON) were received and adopted; and a vote of thanks was accorded to the Provincial Grand Treasurer for his services.

The Provincial Grand Secretary announced that he had received no nomination for the office of Provincial Grand Treasurer; W. Bro. A. W. Warso was thereupon duly re-elected.

The report of the General Committee upon the Wal Relief Fund was received, adopted, and ordered to be entered on the minutes.

The report of the Masonic Millio. Memorical Fund was taken as read, and was received and adopted. The Rt. W. Grand Master referred to the splendid work done by the Provincial Representative, W. Bro. C. D. EATON, P. F.STO.BR.ENG., and congratulated both him and the Province on the magnificent response made to his appeal. He intimated that a meeting of the Masters and Collectors would shortly be read at Worcester to discuss the possibility of increasing the amount already promised to such a sum as would entitle this Province to have its name inscribed permanents, on the walls of the new Temple. The Rt. W. Grand Master later announced that a Brother who rished to remain anonymous would contribute £500 towards that object.

A letter was read, as follows, from the Secretary of the Royal Masonic Institution for Boys:-

GT. QUEEN STREET, KINGSWAY, LONDON, 15th July, 1925.

A the Quarterly Court of Subscribers, held on the 10th inst., the following resolutions were unanimously do ) ted:

"That cordial congratulations and best thanks be conveyed to the Brethren of the Chairman's Province of Worcestershire, who supported their chief at the hands of 713 Stewards, with a collection for the Province of £12,294 is. od."

The Rt. W. Provincial Grand Master, in moving the adoption of the report, took the opportunity of expressing his sincere personal thanks to the Brethren of the Province for their generosity in supporting him at the Boys' Festival with such a splendid contribution. To W. Bro. C. P. Perry Hon. Secretary of the Charity Organization (A.G. Std. Br. Eng.), and to W. Bro. Alfred Alley, P.P.G.W., he tendered a special vote of thanks for their indefatigable labours in achieving accommagnificent result, which was most gratifying, especially for so small a Province. The grand total for the Festival, however, could not have been reached but for the handsome assistance regioned from the Provinces of Warwickshire and South Wales (Eastern Division).

The Rt. W. Grand Master extended a very hearty welcome to Rt. W. Bro. col. W. F. Wy Provincial Grand Master of Warwickshire, and asked him to accept and convey to the Bre. hren of his Province the very sincere thanks of Worcestershire.

It was a matter of great regret that the Deputy Provincial Grand Master of S. Vales (E.D.), W. Bro. Sir David W. Evans, I.P.M. 4004, was unable to be present o ving to severe illness. The Provincial Grand Secretary was requested to write to him, conveying the sympathy and best wishes of this Provincial Grand Lodge for his speedy recovery, couped with most sincere thanks for the substantial support given by South Wales (E.D.) at the recent Pestival.

Col. W. F. Wyley, V.D., D.L., Provincial Grane Master of Warvickshire, briefly replied to the remarks of the Provincial Grand Master, and said it would always be a pleasure for Warwickshire to assist its sister Province whenever possible for they never proceed the help given to him when he presided at the Benevolent Institution a few years ago.

W. Bro. C. P. Perry, Asst.G.St. B. Eng., P.P.G.W., was re-elected Hon. Secretary of the Charity Organization. The thank of Provincial Cran Lodge were accorded to him for his excellent work.

The report of the Library and Museum Committee was taken as read, received, and adopted. W. Bro. T. Mason, P.P.G. V., drew particular attention to that part of the report making special mention of the presentation to the Museum by W. Bro. C. D. Eaton, P.G.Std.Br.Eng., P.P.G.W., of the unique collection of 49 Cen enary Jewels issued prior to the standard pattern in 1867. The Deputy Provincial Crand Master (W. Bro. W. T. Page, P.G.D.Eng.) spoke of this as the most important gin made to the Justum since its establishment, and the Province would wish to associate with this resolution their grateful thanks for this generous gift.

A chection was then taken for charitable purposes—amounting to £23 IIs. od., and the Provincial Grand Treasurer was requested to make this sum up to Thirty Guineas—and given in equal amounts to the Moseley Convalescent Home for Children, Alcester Road, Moseley, and the Women's Lospital, Sparkhill, Birmingham.

W. Bro. C. A. Roberts, C.B.E., P.P.G.W. (Bucks)., P.M. "Herschal" Lodge, 1894, was nominated as representative on the Board of General Purposes for Group 7.

The Rt. W. Provincial Grand Master appointed W. Bro. T. Mason, P.P.G.W. as his representative on the General Committee under By-Law No. 6.

W. Bro. R. A. E. Payne, P.A.G.D.C.Eng., P.P.G.W., and W. Bro. W. J. Hill, P.P.G.W., were elected to serve on the General Committee under By-Law No. 6. The Rt. W. Provincial Grand Master and the Deputy Provincial Grand Master referred to the resignation from this Committee of W. Bro. C. D. Eaton, P.G.Std.Br.Eng., and it was resolved to record his most valuable services for so many years as a member of this Committee.

The Provincial Grand Secretary, W. Bro. R. A. E. PAYNE, P.A.G.D.C.Eng., reported that all Fees of Honour had been paid.

The Rt. W. Provincial Grand Master said that before appointing his officers he had a fam. Ancement to make which would, he knew, be received with the greatest regret throughout the P ovince: namely, the resignation as Provincial Grand Secretary of W. Bro. R. A. E. PAYNE, P. A. D.C. ENG., who was appointed Provincial Grand Secretary and Hon. Secretary of the Churty Organization in April, 1915. He, personally, owed a great deal to W. Bro. PAYNE for his given assistance, and he asked him to accept from the Brethren of his Province a gift of a silver tray, suitably inscribed.

W. Bro. W. T. Page, Deputy Provincial Grand Master, also spole in feeling from of the work given to the Province for so many years by W. Bro. PAYNE.

W. Bro. PAYNE, in accepting the gift, said that the presentation had aken him completely by surprise. He thanked the Rt. W. Provincial Grand Master and the Leputy Provincial Grand Master for their extremely kind words, and the Brethren of the Province for their very handsome gift.

# Masonic Million Memorial Fund.

# MASONIC MILLION MEMORIAL FUND

T the date of my last Report, the amount promised by the Lodges in the Province and the to £7,142 3s. 4d., of which £4,460 12s. 5d. had been paid into the Grand Lodge Fund; and at the Meeting of the Provincial Grand Lodge on October 1/th. 1925, a member of "St. Laurence" Lodge, No. 2724, who desired to remain anonymous, paid in a donation of £000, increasing the total to £7,642 3s. 4d.

One of the conditions of the Fund is that "Every Province of District whose total list, including its own donation, amounts to an average of Two Hundred and Fifty Guineau per Lodge shall have its name recorded in the building."

To comply with this condition, Worcestershie, with thirty-one Lodges, required a total sum of £8,137 10s. od.; and as the amount promised was within £500 cl this sum, the Rt. Wor. Provincial Grand Master called a meeting of the Wor. Masters and Collectors to consider the position. The meeting was held at Worcester on December 5th, 1925, S. Francis J. Davies, P.G.M., occupying the chair; and it was unanimously rise vector after considerable discussion, that an effort should be made to secure the additional amount, and provisional provision were made by the Collectors present which assured success.

I am pleased to report that on August 25th last I had received a total amount in promises of £8,335 4s. 10d., of which Grand Lodge contined £4,930 11s. 11d. as having been received at Headquarters. Since that date a further £115 has been plomised. I have endeavoured to bring these figures up to date, but for want of repure from several of the Lodges amount to do so.

I an., however, periently confident that ultimately the qualifying amount will be forthcoming in the Prevince, but you. I remind the Collectors that owing to the length of time allowed and the many undoese in events which occur over a period of five years, a certain proportion is almost certain to remain uncollected, and if we are to secure the desired position of a "Recorded Provincial Grand Lodge" we cannot afford to slacken in our efforts to secure additional promises until success is assured.

I would wish to express my deep and sincere appreciation of the efforts made by the Masters and Collectors of the Lodges in the Province; without their hearty co-operation my task would have been impossible.
