CEREMONIAL.

1. The Procession will form at St. John's Church.

Arrived at the entrance to the Site, the Brethren will divide to the right and left, facing inwards, leaving an avenue through which

who will pass up, followed by the Present Officers of Provincial Grand Lodge, who are acting Officers, to the Foundation Stone, where they will take their places.

The Officiating Brethren will take their positions near the Stone as plan sent to them.

2. Bro. the Rev. B. H. Green, A.K.C., Vicar of St. John's, will address the Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master and request him to lay the Foundation Stone.

The Stone will be raised.

3. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master will address the assembly.
4. The Provincial Grand Chaplain will offer up Prayer.
5. The Provincial Grand Treasurer will place a phial in the cavity after announcing its contents.
6. The Provincial Grand Secretary will read aloud the Inscription on the Stone.
7. The cement will be laid on the lower stone, and the Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master will adjust the same with a Trowel handed to him for the purpose.
8. The upper Stone will be lowered by three distinct movements and adjusted by the Architect.
9. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master will adjust the Stone on its bed by striking it on the four corners with the Mallet (handed to him by its bearer) saying:—

“With Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence and Justice let our work be founded.”

10. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master will now prove the just position and form of the Stone by the Plumb Rule, Level and Square, which will be successively delivered to him by the Provincial Junior Grand Warden, the Provincial Senior Grand Warden and the Deputy Provincial Grand Master. Being satisfied in these particulars, he will give the Stone three knocks with the Mallet.

11. The Architect, Mr. Webb, will be presented to the Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master and deliver the plans of the Building.

12. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master inspects the plans and hands them back.

13. The Bearers of the Vessels containing the Corn, Wine, Oil and Salt will take up their positions.

14. The Provincial Grand Chaplain reads Psalm lxxii, ; verse 16.

15. The Brethren sing—

When once of old, in Israel,
Our early brethren wrought with toil,
Jehovah's blessing on them fell,
In showers of corn, and wine, and oil.

16. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master scatters Corn—the emblem of Plenty and Abundance.

17. MUSICAL RESPONSE—“Glory be to God on high.”

18. The Provincial Grand Chaplain reads Numbers, chap. xv., verse 7.

19. The Brethren sing—

When there a shrine to Him alone
They built with worship sin to foil
On threshold and on corner-stone
They poured out corn, and wine, and oil.

CEREMONIAL—Continued.

20. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master pours Wine—the emblem of Joy and Gladness.

21. MUSICAL RESPONSE—"Glory be to God on high."

22. The Provincial Grand Chaplain reads Exodus, chap. xxx., verses 25 and 26.

23. The Brethren sing—

And we have come fraternal bands,
With joy, and pride, and prosperous spoil,
To honour Him by votive hands,
With streams of corn, and wine, and oil.

24. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master pours Oil—the emblem of Peace and Unity.

25. MUSICAL RESPONSE—"Glory be to God on high."

26. The Provincial Grand Chaplain reads Leviticus, chap. ii, verse 13.

27. The Brethren sing—

Now o'er our work this salt we shower,
Emblem of Thy conservant power;
And may Thy Presence, Lord, we pray
Keep this Thy Temple from decay.

28. The Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master sprinkles Salt—the emblem of Wisdom, Fidelity, and Perpetuity.

29. MUSICAL RESPONSE—"Glory be to God on high."

30. The Provincial Grand Chaplain will give the Dedication Prayer.

31. The Hymn "Now thank we all our God" will be sung, during which the Offertory will be taken.

Now thank we all our God, With heart and hands and voices, Who wondrous things hath done, In Whom His world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms Hath blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love, And still is ours to-day. 32. The Provincial Grand Chaplain will pronounce the patriarchal Benediction.

33. The National Anthem.

34. The Ceremonies concluded, the Provincial Grand Lodge will return to St. John's Church.

The Procession is formed in inverted order, the Provincial Grand Tyler, Director of Ceremonies and Sword Bearer taking the lead, followed by the Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master, Standard Bearers, the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Wardens, Officers and Brethren according to rank.

35. The Provincial Grand Lodge will be closed.

N.B. Brethren to appear at the Ceremonies in black coats, dark trousers, black ties, white gloves, with full Masonic Craft clothing, the apron outside coat. Craft and Royal Arch Jewels only to be worn.
