Ceremonial

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, accompanied by those Brethren assisting in the Ceremony, will proceed from the Hospital to the site of the Laying of the Foundation Stone.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master having taken up his position, all present will remain standing while the National Anthem is sung.

(It is requested that all prefent be seated throughout the Ceremony except during the Prayers and until the singing of the Hymn at the conclusion.)

The Chairman of the Board of Management (R.W.Bro. The Hop. Mr. justice Hilbery, P.G.W.) will invite the Most Worshipful The Grand Master to lay the Foundation Stone.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will signly his willingness to do so.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will direct that the Stone be raised by the Clerk of Works (Mr. A. J. C. Humphreys, M.I.C.W.) and the Building Foreman (Mr. D. Crooks).

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will address those present.

The Lord Bishop of London (Bro. the Rt. Rev. and Rt. Hon. H. C. Montgomery Campbell, M.C., D.D.) will say:—

- "Except the Lord build the house their labour is but lost that build it.
- "Let us invoke the blessing of the Great Architect of the Universe.
- "Almighty and Eternal God, Great Architect of the Universe, who dost from Thy Throne behold all the dwellers upon Earth, direct us in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help that, in this and in all our work begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name."

So mote it be.

The Deputy Chairman of the House Committee (V.W.Bro. John Harrison O.S.M., P.G.D.) will put the coins and papers in the cortainer, and place it in the cavity.

The Most Vorshipful The Grand Master will ask the Grand Secretary (R.W.Bro. Sir Sydney White, K.C.V.O., P.G.W) to read the inscription on the Stone.

To the Glory of God and in the Service of the Brethren this Foundation Stone of the Extension of the Royal Masonic Hospital was laid by The Rt. Hon. The Earl of Scarbrough, K.G., G.C.S.I., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., T.D., the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, President of the Hospital, on the 24th July, 1956."

The Architect (Gordon T. Tait, Esq., F.R.I.B.A.) will present the Trowel to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will spread cement on the lower stone with the Trowel.

The Stone will then be lowered.

The Honorary Treasurer and a Toustee (F.W.Bro. Philip C. Bull, D.S.O., T.D., Provincial Grand Master for Middlesex) will hand the Maul to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, who will adjust the Stone by striking it on the four corners saying: "With Temperance, Fortitude Prudence and Justice let our work be founded."

V.W.Brc. Major R. L. Loyd, O.B.E., M.C., O.S.M., P.G.D., will nand the Plumb Rule to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, who will prove the Stone plumb

R.W.Bro. the Rt. Hon. Lord Harris, M.C., V.L., P.G.W will hand the Level to the Most Worshipful The Crand Master, who will prove the Stone level.

The President of the Board of General Purposes, a Trustee (R.W.Bro. Sir Ernest Cooper, D.L., P.G.W.) will hand the Square to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, who will prove the Stone square.

R.W.Bro. Philip C. Bull, D.S.O., T.D., will again hand the Maul to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, who will strike the Stone three times saying: "By the power in me vested, and in the name of the Great Architect of the Universe, I declare this Stone well and truly laid."

The Chairman of the Building ard Premises Committee (W.Bro. Sir Harry Selley P.C.D.) will present the Plans to the Most Worshipful The Grand Master saying: "Most Worshipful Crand Master, deign to inspect the whole Design."

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master: "I will do so with pleasure" (inspects the Plans and hands them each). "With the implements of our Craft and these instructions, may there be raised a superstructure perfect in all its parts and honourable to the builders."
