## THE "K. T. CLUB."



THE Members of the Order of the Temple residing out of London, having little or no opportunity of social intercourse either among themselves, or with their London brethren, it has been deemed advisable to form a Club, after the fashion of Scientific and County Clubs, meeting once or oftener in each year in London for the purpose of dining together the days before the Meetings of Great Priory.

At a Meeting held at Freemasons' Tavern, London, on the 9th day of December, 1875, it was decided that such a Club be formed, and be governed by the following Rules.

## R U L E S .

1. The Club to consist of an unlimited number of members, (they being Knights of the Order of the Temple, whether by its present or any other denomination) and shall be called the "K. T. Club."

2. The Members to dine together on the days before the holding of Great Priory, and when Convent General meets in London the days before the holding thereof.

A plain Dinner to be provided at some place to be named at the preceding Meeting, at a cost not exceeding 7s. 6d. each, to be paid for out of the Funds of the Club.

3. Special Meetings of the Club may be called by the Committee, or on the requisition of Six Members, the Dinner at such Special Meetings, to be paid for by those present.

4. The Entrance Fee to be Five Shillings. Annual Subscription for Members residing within the London Postal District One Guinea, for other Members Ten Shillings and Sixpence. Such last mentioned Members to be entitled to one Dinner only per annum out of the funds of the Club. Annual subscriptions to be payable in advance, and to become due at the May meeting. Entrance fee and subscription to be paid at election.

5. The President and Vice-President to be elected by show of hands at each meeting.

6. The fee for every Visitor attending the Dinner to be 10s. 6d., to be paid by the Member introducing him.

7. The Committee shall consist of five Members, to be elected annually at the May meeting.

8. The TREASURER and SECRETARY—the two officers being combined in one person—

shall be elected annually at the meeting of the Club in May. He shall keep a separate book of accounts, in which the receipts and expenditure shall be regularly and clearly set forth, keep a list of the Members and summon them to the meetings, and keep correct minutes of proceedings in the manner usual in similar associations.

9. The Names of Candidates to be proposed shall be sent to the Honorary Secretary at least ten days prior to the meeting at which the ballot is to take place, that the same may be placed on the agenda paper. The ballot shall be the first business transacted after dinner. Two black balls shall exclude. Each original member shall have the right of nominating two new members without ballot.

10. All transactions of the Club and all conversations during its meetings are confided to the honor of the Members.

11. In case any circumstance should arise likely to be injurious to the welfare of the Club, the Committee, upon requisition by the Honorary Secretary, to whom the report shall be made, shall, upon a seven-days' notice, call a General Meeting to consider and adjudicate upon the affair. Should the conduct of a member be in question, then his name may be removed from the list, and he cease to be a Member; provided two-thirds of the Members present approve, on the ballot, the absolute necessity of such a course.

At the meeting before referred to, Eminent Sir Knight J. EDWARD CURTEIS, Preceptor Royal Sussex Preceptory, P.P.G.Reg., Provincial Chancellor, Devon, was unanimously elected Treasurer and Secretary *pro. tem.*
