GENERAL DUTIES OTOHE MEMBERS.
1.-Obedience to the ©nster of Line Lodge, and to the commands of the Gran Nodge of England; charity towards foorer bretheren, hospitality to guests, masenic ohd gelte manly conduct on every occasion in atd out oit the Lodge; love of truth and unsulliea bonor shoead be the characteristics of every Member of the Py lish National Lodge, and therefore, mar one of them infringing these bye-laws, or found deficientil any of the qualities just specified, must, on conviction in open lodge, be struck off the list.
2.-Each Member of the Polish National Lodge is a guardian of its good fame, and the Master for the time being with all his Officers, are especially bound strictly to guard its honor: nor should any Member of the Polish National Lodge for a moment forget, that the same stain, which rests unremoved upon one of them, sullies the whole Lodge and the name it bears.

## INITIATION and AFFILIATION.

3.-Every Candidate for Initiation or membership, must be proposed and seconded by a Member in open Lodge, and balloted for at the next Meeting of the Lodge; one black ball shall exclude, and the Candidate cannot again be proposed, until six month hate elapsed from the time of his rejection.
4.-The Polish National Lodge beingcoliofly gonposed of Polish Exiles, charges for mitiation the lowest sum allowed by the Statute Book of Fuglish Freemasonry, viz Four Guineas, nor dees the lodge exact any specified sum as "entranc money", or "joining fee," but it leans to the bood will and the means of each joinin Member to give towards the Funds of the Lortg, what he can well at the time afford.
5.-Every Brother © joining the Lodge is bound to pay-1st the Iegistration Fee-2nd if he is not an Engtish The son 6s. 6d. for his Grand Lodge Crtificato; both of which sums must be paid by the Lodge on account of the joining Brother to the Grand Lodge of England-3rd Seven Shillings for his deco-ration-lastly, his yearly subscription for the maintenance of the Lodge-It is also provided by these Bye-Laws, that a Brother who has not paid all these dues, can neither vote nor exercise any of the privileges belonging to the Members of the Polish National Lodge.
6.-Each Member of the Polish National Lodge, with the exception of Honorary Members, shall pay One Guinea per annum, either in one payment or by instalments of 5 s . 3 d . each quarter day, such subscriptions being always 1ayable in advance; out of the sum so arising all the expenses of the lodge are to do paid, including 4s. per year for each Member of the Polish National Lodge to the Fund of Berciolence. If any Member be one quarter in arrea, he shall be written to by the Secretary, if two, he shar be reported to the Lodge, if three, he shall be onsidered unfit for any office in the Lodge, and foour, he reases to be a Member of the Polish Nathoral Lodse. unless such delay shall be accounted tor to the sutisfaction of the lodge.

> TECORAT1QNS.
7.-The peculiar decoration or distinctive jewel granted to th. Delish Na ioval Lodge by the M.W.G.M. of England, and described in the warrant dated 28 Augusk, 1. L. 5846 A. D. 1846 , is to be called the Polish White Egle. Every Member of the Polish Natighal Lhlge has a right to wear this decoration in all Magonic assemblies: but to prevent irregularities, he thlus have a Certificate of his having been duly invested with it. The Certificate is to be given in the name of the W.M. under the Seal of the Polish National Lodge, and signed by him and the other Officers for the time being-This decoration is to be worn at the button hole, on blue and black riband, also described on the warrant.
8. - The W.M., with the unanimous consent of the Members present in open lodge, may confer upon any Member the right of wearing this decoration round the neck, attached to the riband by a Gold Royal Crown, and to be called the Commander's White Eagle.
9.-To commemorate for ever the names of the M.W.G.M. under whose protection the Polish National Lodge was established in this country $1 \mathrm{~m} d$ of the M.W.D.G.M. who presided at its cposecration, the W.M. of the Polish National Lodgefgr the time being shall wear the decoration callad the Conmander's White Eagle, on which shali be engra ed the names of the Right Honorable Fani of Zetzand, and of the Right Honorable Earl of Yalborough; with this jewel every Mastes of thi. Polish National Lodge shall be invest at the cine of his installation.

## MEETIIGS and BANQUETS

10. Whe \%einary meetings of the Polish National Idge shail Se held on the second Thursday in the nonths of Neptember, October, November, December, January, February, March, April, and May, at 8 o'clock in the evening, in the Freemasons' Tavern, Great Queen-street, Lincoln's-inn-fields. The Master, Treasurer, and Tyler, shall be elected at the meeting in May. The Master is empowered to call lodges of emergency. Every Member shall receive at least
seven days previous to the meeting of a lodge, whether ordinary or of emergency, notice thereof. The notice is to contain the order of the day.
11.-The second Thursday in June shall be considered as the Anniversary of the consecration of the lodge. The Lodge on that day shall meet at 4 ocheck for the purpose of installing the Master, the Theasurer and the other Officers of the Lodge. After each Anniversary Meeting there shall br a Banquen, to which as many guests shall be inmed, as the funds of the lodge can reasonably alnit of lavitations rest with the W. M. for thetime being and shall be confined to those Brethren who are eminent in the craft, or whose Lodgehave recejved with hospitality any member of the Polish Netional Lodge. Neither guests invited (5y) the M.M. nor Honorary Members of the lodge pay anything towards the expenses of the Bâquet; every other Brother wishing to be present at the Banquet shall leave One Guinea with the ry reasyan Every Member of the Polish National Lodge Ifving within 15 miles of St. Paul's Church is bouad to attend this Banquet of the Lodge, and in case of non-attendance, unless arising from illness, certified by another Brother, the Guinea shall still be payable to the funds of the Lodge.
12.-At every Meeting of the Lodge, the minutes of the last lodge shall be read in the first place, after the lodge has been opened, and put for confirmation;
and when approved signed by the W.M.; the Report of the Treasurer shall then be read. At the Anniversary Meeting the Report of the Auditors shall be read after the Minutes.
of the officers of the lodge.
13.-All monies payable to the Lodge shall bera ceived by the Treasurer who, previously to each meeting of the lodge, shall make out an account of his receipts and disbursements since the (astmee inse shewing the balance remaining in hishands.
14.-The Master shall at the meeting in May nominate a Committee, cons sting of tlDes Members, to audit the accounts of Treazuer for the past year, and they shall report to bue next meeting of the lodge.

15 -It ie theoduty onthe Secretary to send notices to the menbers of a/dreetings of the lodge, to keep minute os the proceedings, and lists of the members and (isifors.
16. - Master of the Ceremonies receives distinguished visitors, and has the charge of all jewels and furniture belonging to the lodge.
17.-The jewels, and all other things appertaining to the Polish National Lodge, are vested in the principal Officers of the lodge for the time being, as their personal property.
18.-The Polish National Lodge, No. 778, being of recent creation, there shall be for the year 1847, 1848 , and 1849 , a double number of Wardens, viz: a first and second senior warden, and a first and second junior warden.
19.-Nothing in these Bye-Laws can be alred or annulled, nor can any addition be made to them, unless, for two consecutive meetings, thensfoy ti's of the Members present at those meetings, agree to alter or annul any regulation herein Contained, os to make any additional regulation. Eycr Member $f$ the Polish National Lodge on his admísion, signs lis name to the Bye-Laws, as a proof his assent to them, and a pledge that he will observe them.
