## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

## $\sqrt{ }$ fremasond Cluf

Yanon Hoese, Pall Mall.
I. The Fercmasins Club is established to provide an agrecale and convenient place of moting, for rembers of the Fraternity ; ana shall cen ist of Brethren connected with bricish o. Foreign Lodges, properly introduceds
II. Each Candidate for admission must be proposed by one member, and seconded by another. The candidate's name and residence, his rank, profession, or other description, and the name of his proposer and
seconder shall be inserted in the "Book of Candidates." The proposer and seconder are held responsible for the eligibility of the Candidate.
III. The election of members shall be by ballot. The ballot shall take place every Wednesday, between the hours of three and five p.m. No ballot shall be valid wentess twenty members actually hete; and one black ball in ten shall eschude. ACist of the candidates to be ballatted for ori each day with their proposers and ecconders, shall be put up in the rofee-roon, at least one week before the Natot, draed and signed by the Secretary. Meroors desirous of recommending any dandidate, may sign their nåmes) in sag list.
IV. The Secretary shall remain in the room during the whole time of the ballot, to deliver the balls, and take down the names of the members who vote; and in the presence of at least one member of
the committee, he shall open the boxes at the close of the ballot.
V. The terms of admission for members enrolled up to the fifth of April 1850 shgil be an entrance fee of ten pounds for members resident in town : and five Foundsion country members. The annue subscristion shall be five guineas.
VI. Each new menter shainhave his admission notified to nim b, the Secretary (in duplicate, if aroad); he shall at the same time be farished with a copy of the Rules of the Cluo, andrequired to remit an order for payment of the amount of his entrance feend subscription.

यIP No member shall be competent to propose or second a candidate for admission into the Club, neither shall he ballot or vote on any occasion whatever, until he shall have paid his annual subscription ; and no newly-elected member shall participate in
any of the advantages of the Club, until he shall have paid his entrance money, and first year's subscription.
VIII. Any new member who shall 106 in compliance with the preceding rule, piave paid the sum therein specified within two months from the day of his admiegton to the Club, if he be in the UnitedCKingdom and within twelve months if he be abroad, shall be reported by the Seeretaryct the Committee, with a view (t) ?iis nane being erased from the list of memters, unless he can justify the chy to che satisfaction of the Committeed

Thenanne of every member failing to pay deallual subscription, due on the first of ox mury, shall be placed in the coffee reom on the first of March, notice of which shall be sent to him by the Secretary ; and if the subscription be not paid on or before the first of April, he shall cease to be a member of the Club, and his name shall be erased
from the books, unless he can justify the delay to the satisfaction of the Committee. Every member who shall have used the Club in any way, after the first of January, shall be liable to the payment of his subscriptio for the current year.
X. Any member who may reabsent from the United Kingdom during (ine whole period within which the annual Bbbscripres is payable, may, by givingontice in Writing to the Secretary of his deptrtur be considered as a supernumeraty member, and be exempted from his senseription@uring the continuance of such absence. The name of every memben mo may haval himself of this rule shall b0. ntered in the list of "Supernumerary Members. At his return he shall be admite? to all the privileges of the Club, on paying his subscription for the current year ; but if his wish to rejoin the Club be not expressed to the Secretary within three months after his return to the United King-
dom, he shall no longer be considered a member thereof.
XI. An annual general meeting of the Club shall be held on the Fth of April, af one o'clock P.m. for the purpose of reaithg a report from the Committee; for electing the Committee for the ensuing jet, and tor discussing such other matters ideating out he well-being of the Club, as shall be thought before the meeting.

XII. The gen rarsuperthtendence of the Club shall be managed by a Committee, consisting of twenty members, who shall make, from time to time? such regulations, consisteat whit h these general rules, as they may thing. necpstary. Seven of the Committee shall retire annually, being eligible for reelection, and the vacancy shall be filled up at the Annual General Meeting. The names of all candidates for the Committee shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary and exhibited in the coffee-room, at least one
week before such meeting. In the event of any vacancies occurring in the Committee after the annual meeting, the Committee shall have the power of filling them up.
XIII. The Committee shall hold a meeting, once at least in every week, transact the current business of the Cloh . Three of the Committee shall form a Gorum.
XIV. Any infractions of che rules and regulations of the (inb shaille taken immediate cognizance of by the Committee.
XV. ilach member shall be allowed to brias two frienus, not members, with him into the Sirangers' Room, in which dinner may be oldered by such member for himself and riends, at a rate to be regulated by the Obnmittee; it being expressly understood that the bill should be discharged by the member. Any friends who are invited to dine in the Strangers' Room, shall be permitted, in company with the member who
entertains them, to use in the evening such room as the Committee shall appropriate for that purpose.
XVI. The Club-house shall be opened (8) nine, and closed at two A. m. Such sinembers, however, as may happen to be actually within the Club are not to be resuricted os influenced with respect to their deparfare by this rule. During Epsom and Accot races, the Committee shall heve the foiner of ordering the Club-house to be opened at an earlier hour.
XVII. Ne strarger shall, at any time, or on any pretence, (1) permitted to use any excedt the Stralgers' Room.

XVKI. The Committee shall have the pewen of admitting as honorary members of the Club, for a period not exceeding two months at a time, such foreigners or other Brethren, as shall be properly recommended to them for that purpose. This admission

may be renewed as often as may be considered advisable. The Secretary, while holding office, shall be an honorary member, but shall not have any vote in the management or the proceedings of the Club.
XIX. No servant belonging to the Clahlhouse shall be allowed to receive any money or gratuity from any member strenger admitted into the Club-hoase, on pain of instant dismissal ; andrthe menther offering or giving such gratfity, shall be fined five guineas for the uoe of the Club.
XX. Nio dice or game of hazard shall, on anyccount, be permitted; nor shall any ligher stake than half-a-guinea points ever be playedor at any game whatever. Any deviation from this rule, upon the same being proved before the Committee, consisting of not less than thirteen members, shall be visited with immediate expulsion.

XXI, A library of the most useful works
shall be collected; and no member shall take, or permit to be taken away from the Club, on any pretence whatever, or shall injure or destroy, any newspaper, book, pamphlet, or other article.
XXII. No member shall be allowed to bring a dog into the Club-rooms.
XXIII. All complaints eoncerning dinners are to be made in witing the Committee, either by letar? or renarks written on the back of the biil.
XXIV. Fes conduct of a servant shall in no instance be made a matter of personal reprimala by any member : but all complaints aĝams sergguts shall be made by letter to the Cominittee, signed by a member complaining.
XXV. All members are to pay their bills for every expense they incur in the Club before they leave the house, the Steward hav-
ing positive orders not to open accounts with any individual.
XXVI. It is considered the duty of the Committee, in case any circumstances shonid occur likely to endanger the welfare or good order of the Club, to call a generd meeting, giving fourteen days' notice; and in the event of its being voted at such meeing, by ballot of two-thirds of the persone present, that the name of any member or members should be removed from the Club, the subscriptions of sicil member or members for the current jen shall b. returned, and he or they shall cease to belong to the Club.
(A) VII. Tbe Committee may at their discretion cail a general meeting of the Club at any time, giving not less than seven days' public notice, and specifying the object, to which alone the discussion shall be confined; the decision of a majority of such meeting shall be final, provided there shall be thirty members present; but if there be less than
thirty, their decision must be unanimous. The Committee shall also call a general meeting of the Club, subject to the preceding restrictions, on the written requisition of twenty members.
XXVIII. No new rule or alteration of ar original rule shall ever be made ingthout the sanction of the annual or of an extraordinary general meeting, convisting of hat least thirty members. If ateny srech annual or extraordinary meetiog ther be less than thirty present, their decisich must be unanimous to effectiny change. It shall be necessary, in wir cases that fourteen days' notice belgiven of the proposed new rule or alteraiion of au original rule, previous to the diaj corg.

XdIX. Each member of the Club shall give his address, or that of his Banker or Agent, from time to time, to the Secretary; and all notices sent to such address shall be considered as duly delivered.
XXX. These Rules and Regulations shall be printed, and a copy of them delivered to every member ; but no member shall be absolved from the effect of these Rules on any allegation of not having received them.
