The Eurampment of Cour de Live, Kulst

1. THE Officers of the Encampment shall consist of an Eminent Commander, a Prelate, two Captains commanding columns. a Registrar, a Treasurer, an Almone, an Expert, two Standard Bearers, an Aid-de-Camp, two Heralds, and two Captains of the Lines; with serving Companions as Equerries of the Outposts, and such other Officers as the Eminent Commander may deen it necessary, for the interests of the Encampment, to appoint.

2 The Eminent Commander and Treasurer shall be elected annually by ballot, at the meeting holden in February, by a majority of the Knights of this Encampment then present, and such election shall be submitted for confirmation at the next regular meeting.

3. The ordinary or regular meetings of this Encampment shall be held in the months of February, May, and November, the precise period being fixed by the Eminest Commander, who shall direct summonses to be issued at least seven days previously. It is desirable that the ordinary meetings of the year should be decided upon by the Eminent Commander at the convention in November.

4. The annual astivat shall be held during the month of May in each year, upon a day to be fixed by the Emment Commander, provided that it shall not take place upon any day appointed by the Church to be observed as a fast. At this meeting the Emment Commander shall be installed, and shall appoint his Officers; the Treasurer also shall enter upon his duties.

6. The Eminent Commander may convene in Encampment of Emergency, as often as, in his judgment, the good of the Order shall require it. If there be any candidate for election at such meeting, or if there be any alteration of or addition to the By-laws proposed, seven days' notice shall be required; otherwise three

Nasonic Trust days shall be deemed sufficient. If it be held for the express purpose of installing any candidate, he shall pay, in addition to the usual fees. the sum of one guinea.

6. Every Member shall annually, in the month of January, pay into the hands of the Treasurer, a subscription of one guinea for the expenses of the current year, and no Member shall vote, or be eligible to fill any office, until he shall have paid such subscription. If he be in arrear at the expiration of nine months from that time, he shall be rounded of his default by letter from the Registrar, and if no satisfactory answer be returned within three months, his name shall be liable to erasure. Members may become he subscribers, on payment of five guineas at the time of installation; of which sum three pounds shall be set apart during the life time or continuance of Membership of each compounder.

7. If any Member desire to withdraw his name from the Encampment, he shall give notice of the same, in writing, to the Registrar. It shall be considered a point of honour not to

quit the Encampment until all dues are fully paid, and the resignation need not be accepted, nor the annual subscription cease until this is complied with.

8. Every candidate for admission into this Encampment shall be proposed, and seconded, and duly ballotted for; but ho ballot for the election of canadates can take place in the Vacations. The name of the Candidate, his residence, and the Royal Arch Chapter in which he has been exalted, or to which he may belong, shall be inserted in the summons, together with the names of the proposer and seconder. On the ballot, the votes must be unanimous for his admission. If elected, the sum of one guinea shall be deposited by his proposer, in part payment of the installation fee; but this sum shall be forfeited, and the election shall be void, if he do not attend for installation within six months after the ballot has taken place. Leave of absence for another six months may however be accorded to the candidate, if the reasons assigned for the delay be satisfactory to the Eminent Commander, but the forfeiture of the deposit shall not be excused.

9. Every candidate for admission into this Encampment must be a person entitled to bear arms, and must deliver a draft of his armorial bearings to the Eminent Commander or Treesurer, previous to the ballot being taken, for the satisfaction of the Encampment. After his installation (or election, if a joining Member,) the said arms shall be duly emblazoned in the vellum book of the Encampment.

10. Every candidate, upon being installed a Knight Templar in this Encampment, shall pay into the hands of the Treasurer the sum of five guineas, for installation, which shall include the registration fee. If the econes a Member of the Encampment, he shall at the same time pay the current year's abscription or such a proportion of it as the Emment Commander may direct.

11. If any Knight who has been a subscribing Member of the Encampment, is desirous of re-addission he shall be proposed and seconded, and his name shall be inserted in the summons with usual manner. If unanimously elected on the ballot, he shall be admitted a subscribing Member upon paying into the hands of the

Treasurer the sum of one guinea, toget in with the current year's subscription, or the proportion thereof.

12. If any Knight who has been installed in another Encampment, or who having been installed in this Encampment has not then become a subscribing domber. Is desirous of joining this Encampment, he shall be proposed and seconded, and his nation shall be inserted in the summore in the usual manner. If unanimously elected on the ballot, he shall be admitted a Member of this Encampment, on paying into the bands of the Treasurer the sum of two gameas, together with the current year's subscription.

13. The degree of Knight of Malta may be conterved at any meeting of the Encampment with or without notice, and the fee payable for admission to this degree shall be half-a-guinea.

14. Each Knight on presenting himself for admission to the meetings of the Encampment, shall be habited in the costume appointed to be worn by the Grand Conclave. He shall also be provided with Banner and Arms, and all the Insignia of his rank.

15. No visitor shall be admitted to the ban quet unless introduced by a Member; and every Member, with the exception of the Endnent Commander, introducing a visitor to the banquet, shall pay into the hands of the Treasurer the sum of one guinea.

16. A meeting of the Eminent Commander, the Captains, Treasurer, and Registrir, shall take place previously to the Annual Festival, for the purpose of examining and auditing the accounts, and of reporting to the Encampment the state of the finances and regalia. The said meeting to be convened by summons, by order of the Eminent Commander.

17. Every Knight is enjoined to bear in mind that out Ancient and Royal Order is founded on the love of God, benevolence to markind, and charity to the poor and distressed. Therefore at every meeting, the poor-box shall be presented to each Knight to receive his donation, and such donations shall be preserved distinct from the funds of the Encarponent, and shall be expended in charity by the Treasurer, under the direction of the Eminear Commander, or by vote of the Encampment.

18. A book of minute shall be kept by the Registrar, wherein the proceedings of the Encampment shall be regularly entered; such entries shall be read for confirmation at the following ordioary meeting, and when approved shall be signed by the Eminent Commander.

19. The matter roll of Members, with their arms emblazoned, and the respective offices to which they are appointed, shall be inscribed in a vellum cook. In the same volume shall be recorded a list of all presents and benefactions, which may be made to the Encampment, and which may be considered worthy of being entered therein.

20. Every Member on his admission shall subscribe his name to the By-laws of the Encampment, and a printed copy thereof shall be delivered to him.

21. No alteration or addition shall be made in or to these By-laws, except by motion mad and seconded in a meeting of the Encampment, which for such a purpose must be held datage. Term, notice thereof having been provide by given, and inserted in the summons.
