TRAVELLING ARRANGEMENTS.—Six persons from any station will be allowed to travel First Class at a fare and a quarter for the double journey. A CRAFT Lodge will be opened in the three degrees at the National Schools, Moseley, by the W.M. and officers of *Stability Lodge*, No. 564 (by request) at 11.30 o'clock.

The Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master and Provincial Grand Officers will enter the Lodge, and having been received with the customary honours, the Provincial Grand Lodge will be opened in due form at 11.45 a.m. The Worshipful Deputy Provincial Grand Master of Warwickshire, Brother Colonel Machen, accompanied by his Provincial Grand Officers, will enter the Lodge, and having been saluted with the customary honours, and nothing further offering, the Provincial Grand Lodge will be closed.

- 1.—The procession will start from the National Schools at 12.30, and proceed to S. Mary's Church, where a short service will be held. On reaching the church gates the Brethren will divide and face inwards as usual.
- 2.—At the close of the Service, the procession will reform, and preceded by the choir, and clergy of the Diocese, take its way to the site in S. Agnes' Road, at 1.30.
- 3.—On arriving at the site the Brethren will divide and face inwards, and those taking no part in the ceremony of laying the stone will be conducted to the platform set apart for them.
- 4.—A hymn will be sung.
- 5.—Bro. the Rev. H. J. COACHAFER, P.M., P.P.G. Chaplain, will offer a prayer.
- 6.—The Rev. W. H. COLMORE, M.A., Chairman of the Building Committee, will address the Provincial Grand Master, and request him to lay the stone.
- 7.—The Provincial Grand Master will address the assembly.
- 8.—The Provincial Grand Chaplain will offer a prayer.
- 9.—The Provincial Grand Master will request the Provincial Grand Secretary to read the Inscription on Plate, and the Provincial Grand Treasurer to deposit the phial containing Coins, &c., in the cavity.
- 10.—A Trowel will be presented to the Provincial Grand Master, by Mrs. C. WILLIAMS.
- 11.—The Provincial Grand Secretary having placed the plate on the lower stone the cement will be laid, and the Provincial Grand Master will adjust the same.
- 12.—Whilst the upper stone is slowly lowered an Anthem will be sung.
- 13.—The Provincial Grand Master will place the position and form of the stone by the Plumb Rule, Level, and Square, successively delivered to him by the Junior Warden, Senior Warden, and Deputy Provincial Grand Master. He will give the stone three knocks with the mallet.
- 14.—The Cornucopia, containing the Corn and the Ewers, with the Wine and Oil, will next be handed to the Provincial Grand Master, who will use them with the accustomed ceremonies.
- 15.—The Provincial Grand Superintendent of Works will hand the Plans of the intended structure to the Provincial Grand Master, and also present to him the Architect, and the Provincial Grand Master having inspected and approved the Plans will return them with the usual requests.
- 16.—The Ladies will now deposit on the Stone the Purses received on behalf of the Building Fund.
- 17.—A Hymn will be sung.
- 18.—The Benediction will be pronounced.
- 19.—The Brethren will keep their places whilst the scene is Photographed (Photographs may be obtained by inquiring through the Provincial Grand Secretary.)
- 20.—The Ceremony being concluded, the Procession will reform as before, and proceed to the Rink, where all articles left at the Schools will have been removed.
- 21.—Public Luncheon in the Rink at 3 o'clock, at which the Provincial Grand Master, Sir E. A. H. LECHMERE, Bart., M.P. will preside. The Brethren will not appear in Masonic Costume at the Luncheon. Full Masonic CRAFT Clothing at the Ceremony.
