The Northcote edition of Anderson's Constitutions (1784) claims that he was a patron of Freemasonry in 1515. Gave Hampton Court to Henry VIII.



BRIGHAM YOUNG (1801-1877) American Mormon leader. Superintended the mass migration of the Mormons to Great Salt Lake Valley in Utah. Although his Masonic Membership has not been proved, it is thought he belonged to the Craft; apparently all the leaders as well as large numbers of rank and file of the Mormon Church were members of Nauvoo Lodges, for when the cornerstone of the Masonic Temple at Nauvoo (which had been deposited there on 24 June, 1843) was opened on 24 June, 1954 by officials of the Mormon Church from Salt Lake City, a list of 50 Mormon-Masons who had signed a document as being present on historic occasions in 1843, including the name of Brigham Young.
