## Anovincial Chand Lodge of Morgestershire

Report of the By-Laws Committee to be presented to the Prov. Grand Lodge to be held at Worcester, on March 17, 1880.

OUR. Committee report that having fully considered the existing By-Laws of the Lodge adopted in 1852, it was deemed desirable as being more simple, to reconmend the Prov. Grand Lodge to repeal them, to substitute in their place the fulle and more complete Laws now presented for adoption. the Book of Constitutions provides for the regulation of Provincial Grand Lodges, and as the rules governing the business of Grand Lodge are in many particulars equally applicable to the conduct of the business of Prov Grand Lodge, your Committee have not thought it necessary to repeat such provisions, but recommend their adoption generally so far as they extend to P.G. Lodges.

In the cont of the adoption of the By-Laws as now presented, your Committee suggest that they be authorised to have same printed for distribution in such order, and with such rebal alterations (if any) as may be found necessary, and that there be added to them for the convenience of the Brethren the necessary references to the particular pages of the Constitutions already referred to, and also that a list be appended of all present and past P.G. Officers and the dates of their appointment and of the places of meeting of the P.G. Lodges hitherto held in the Province so far as the records thereof extend.

E. A. H. LECHMERE, P.G.M., Chairman. HE Provincial Grand Lodge of Worcestershire having at a Meeting held on the 16th day of September, in the year of Light, 5879, Resolved that the existing By Laws made June 16, 5852, be revised,

It is Resolved at a Meeting of the Provincial Grand Lodge specially convened for the curpose, and held on the 17th day of March, 5880, That the existing By Laws be and they are hereby repealed, and that in addition to the regulations contained in the Bool of Constitutions having particular reference to Provincial Grand Lodges and the rules and regulations laid down for the government of the Grand Lodge as far as these may be applicable to Provincial Grand Lodges, the following By Laws be also adopted by this Provincial Grand Lodge:—

That the members of the collective body forming this Provincial Grand Lodge take rank within the Province in the following order.

- 1. The Provincial Grand Master.
- 2 The Deputy Prov. Grand Master.
- 3. Prov. Grand Wardens.
- . Prov. Grand Chaplains.
- 5. Prov. Grand Treasurer.
- 6. Prov. Grand Registrar.
- 7. Prov. Grand Secretary.
- 8. Prov. Grand Deacons.
- 9. Prov. Grand Supt. of Works.
- 10. Prov. Grand Director of Ceremonies.
- 11. Assistant Prov. Grand Director of Ceremonies.
- 12. Prov. Grand Sword Bearer.

- 13. Prov. Grand Organist.
- 14. Prov. Grand Pursuivant.
- 15. Assistant Prov. Grand Pursuivant.
- 16. Prov. Grand Stewards for the Year.
- The W.M., Past Masters and Wardens of the private Lodges within the Province.
- 18. Prov. Grand Tylers.

The Provincial Grand Lolge shall meet once at least in every year, at a time to be fixed by the P.G.M., and at such the as may have been nominated by him at the previous annual This Leting shall be deemed the Annual Prov. Grand Lodge at which the Election of Prov. Cand Treasurer and the appointment of Prov. Grand Officers shall take place. A Report on the state of Masonry in the Province as made to Grand Lodge shall be read and the Reports from the Auditors and the Benevolent and Charity Committees shall be read and considered. No ther business involving discussion shall be brought forward unless one month's notice in writing has been given to the P.G. Secretary of an intention to introduce it, nor then unless notice has been given in the summons convening the Lodge. At these Meetings, Master Masons not members of the P.G.L. provided they be subscribing members to some Lodge, may by permission of the P.G.M. be allowed to be present, but they

cannot vote, nor can they take any part in the proceedings, unless requested by the P.G.M. to do so. After the Annual Meeting there shall be a Masonic Festival, to be so arranged by the P.G. Stewards that no expense in respect thereof fall upon the P.G.L. Funds.

Every Brother on his first appointment to either of the following offices, shall incrediately pay to the P.G. Treasurer, towards the funds for general purposes, the following Fees of honor, namely:—

If the office of Prov. Grand Steward has not been served, an additional Fee of 5s. shall be paid on appointment to a higher rank.

No Brother shall be allowed to rank as Past Grand Officer, unless he has duly and truly served his office for a period of twelve months (unless by dispensation from the Prov. Grand Master) and paid his appointed Fee.

Should any Officer in Prov. Grand Lodge become vacant, the P.G.M. may, if he thinks it necessary to do so, fill up such vacancy by a written appointment, and the Brother so appointed shall from the date thereof take rank in his office in the same manner as if he had been appointed, and invested at the Annual P.G. Lodge, and a procord of such special appointment shall be entered on the minutes of the next Prov. Grand Lodge. In these cases the Fee of honor shall be payable to the P.G. Treasurer within 14 days of each appointment.

Every Prov. G. Officer shall be responsible for the safe custody of the jewe of his otice and shall return it at the Annual Prov. Grand Lodge to the Prov. Grand Treasurer, under the penalty of One Guinea, in case of default, to the Fund of General Purposes.

The following Dues are payable to the Prov. Grand Lodge Fund for General Purposes:—

Cur the Consecration of a new Lodge - 5 5 0
On the initiation of a Candidate - 0 5 0
On a Brother joining a Lodge - - 0 1 0
For every Dispensation, License or permission - - - 5 0
And to the Prov. Grand Lodge Fund of Benevolence.

Annually for each Member of a Lodge i.e. sixpence per quarter - 5 0 2 0

The W.M. for the time being is responsible for these Fees and Contributions.

Every Dispensation License or permission required by the book of Constitutions to be given by the Prov. Grand Master, shall be in writing, and be obtainable only through the Prov. Grand Secretary.

All monies payable to Pro. G. Lodge shan be paid to the P.G. Treasurer for the time being, whose receipts shall be the only legal discharge for the same, and the Property of the Prov. G. Lodge shall be vested in him, but the care and custody of the Furniture, Banners, Jewels, Ac., shall belong to the Prov. G.D. of Ceremonies for the time being as part of his official duties and he shall annually certify that they are complete and in good order and condition, or otherwise, which certificate shall be annexed to the Report of the Auditors of the Lodge Accounts. All movies belonging to the Prov. G. Lodge shall be deposited in the Bank of Messrs. Berwick, Lechrorre, Isaac, Isaac, & Martin, or in such other Bank or on such securities as the Prov. G. Ledge when duly assembled, shall direct. The Treasurer shall keep the P.G. Lodge accounts, separating the Fund of Benevolence, the Fund of General Purposes, and the Charity Lund in a book or books which shall be audited by two members of Prov. G. Lodge to be annually nominated by the P.G. Master and such accounts having been certified by them, an abstract thereof shall be sent to the W.M. of each Lodge in the Province in or before the first week in May in each Year, and such abstract, together with the Auditor's Report, shall be presented to the Annual meeting of P.G.L.

A Committee of five (of whom the Prov. G. Treasurer, and Prov. G. Secretary shall be two) shall be annually elected to administer the Benevolent Fund of the Prov. G. Lodge, and to investigate the Petitions of Brethren once members of a Lodge in the Province, or their widows, applying for relief, and to recommend what sums should be respectively awarded to each of the applicants at any regular Meeting of the Prov. G. Lodge with a discretionary power to them to relieve any cases of emergency to the extent of £5, to any one person in the This Committee shall be called the Benevolent Fund Computee and shall report annually to Prov. G. Lodge Its operations shall mutatis mutanais be regulated by the same provisions as the Cond I care of Benevolence.

All Petitions must be certified according to the forms required, and must be sent to the Prov. G. Scretary at least a month before the Meeting of the Prov. G. Lodge, and no grant shall be made wiless this rule be complied with.

The operations of the Benevolent Committee and of the Charity Committee hereinafter named being exclusively in the interests of Masonic Charity their reasonable expenses, subject to the approval of the Prov. Grand Lodge, may be paid out of the Benevolent Fund. The annual premium for the Insurance on the life of P.P.G.M. Vernon, shall also be paid out of this Fund. All expenses connected with the conduct of the business of Prov. Grand Lodge, may be paid out of the Fund for General Purposes.

Here follow the rules of the Charity Committee if passed by the P.G.L.

(No. Subject to the addns. of the Charity Rules).

## A.

The annual report of the Charity Committee shall comprise a statement of the Candidates adopted by them, the number of Votes given for any Candidate, and of those lent or correspond in aid, and from or to what Ledges or Charity Committees. Such report when adopted by P.G.L. shall be entered on the minutes thereof.

P,

The Prov. Grand Secretary shall issue summonses to the Members of Prov. Grand Lodge, at least a fortnight before each P.G.L. Meeting. which shall notify the lusiness to be transacted, he shall attend all such meetings and make minutes of all transactions which shall be transcribed in a book to be kept by him for the purpose, in or ler that the same may be laid before P.G. Lodge vhen required. He shall send the blank forms of the annual or other returns to be nade to P.G.L. to each Lodge in the Province, on or before the 1st day of December in each year, and shall make an analysis, or abstract of such returns, when received back, to enable the P.G. Master to make his annual report to Grand Lodge as to the state of Masonry in the Province.

C.

The Master of every Lodge in the Province shall make such Returns as may, from time to

time, be required by the P.G.M. and shall in the month of January in every year make a regular return to the Prov. G. Secretary through the P. G. Treasurer, of the members belonging thereto, made out according to seniority of admission into the Lodge, with the date of the initiation or joining and full description of each Brother not previously returned, and the P.G. Secretary shall, make a Register thereof. And the Master of every Lodge in the Province shall, with the return, transmit to the P.G. Treasurer the Fees due to Me P.G.I. transmitted before the first of March, he shall forfeit One Guinea to the Fund of Benevolence. In case of continued reglect, the defaulting Lodge will be reported to Grand Lodge. The other official returns to be made shall be sent to the P.G. Scretary direct.
D.

No person resident, in or near any town or place where a Lodge is established, shall be balloted for into any Lodge held elsewhere within this Province, unless the Master of the Lodge wherein he seeks admission shall previously make enquiry in writing of the Master of each Lodge in the Town, in or near which the Candidate resides, touching the fitness of such Candidate. Brother of whom such enquiry is made, if the Master of a Lodge in the Province, shall, and if out of the Province is fraternally requested to make prompt reply thereto in writing, and it shall be incumbent on the Master to read the reply to the Members of the Lodge before the ballot is taken. In the case of a joining Member a similar course shall be pursued and reference shall be had to his having fully discharged his Masonic engagements in the Lodge of which he was last a Member.

## E

SORIK

In the event of this Provincial Grand Lodge ceasing to exist, according to the provisions of the Constitutions, the action of the Benevolon Fund Committee and the Charity Committee may be continued, but it shall be, subject to review on the Lodge being again established. The Prov. G. Treasurer may discharge the proper liabilities of P.G.L. on its so ceasing to exist, but otherwise the Fund of General Purposes must remain intact until the P.G.L. is again established.

F

The Master of each Lodge shall cause a copy of the summon of every meeting to be forwarded to the P.G.M., the deputy P.G.M., and the P.G. Secretary, it the same time they are forwarded to the Members of such Lodge.

G.

These laws and Regulations shall be binding or all the Lodges within this Province, and shall not be litered, or added to, except by a Prov. Grand Lodge after one Month's previous notice in writing to the Prov. Grand Secretary. All resolutions of the Prov. Grand Lodge and By-Laws passed in Prov. Grand Lodge after such notice, shall require no further confirmation.
