From ancient time Master or Fellow could be absent from his Lodge, especially when warned to appear at it, without incurring a severe censure, unless it appeared to the Master and Wardens that pure necessity hindered him.—Ancient Charge.

## A tera nce at Lodges Overseas.

The Board receive in ormation from time to time of cases where members of Lodges go abroad and become involved generally through ignorance, with Masonic Bodies not recognised as regular by the United Grand Lodge. The Board was less to draw attention to this danger, and to point out that the best method of comboing it is for Lodges to impress upon their members that they should not make any Masonic contacts overseat your Masons of other jurisdictions without having ascertained by application to the Grand Secretary of From asons' Hall, the existence of regular Masonry in the Country concerned, and the address to which Masonic enquiries in that country should be directed.
