A SHORT HISTORY OF "AD ASTRA LODGE,"

No. 3808.

In the early spring of 1917, the possibility, and above all the advisability, of forming a Lodge from the Freemasons connected with the A.I.D., was considered by Brig.-General Bagnall-Wild, C.M.G., C.B.E. and Lieut.-Colonel Outram, C.B.E.

On May 7th, 1917, an informal meeting was held at the A.I.D. Headquarters, Adastral House, at which Brig. General Bagnall-Wild was invited to take the chair, there being 10 Masons present including Col. Outram, Major Taylor, Major Bulman and Lieut. G. J. Ayling.

The Chairman briefly stated his proposal, both as a means of promoting the principles of the craft and to bring together in brotherly and social intercourse Masons who were then engaged in a common purpose and scattered over a wide field of activity. He considered that it was probable that the existence of the Department would not cease at the end of the War, and though many of its members would doubtless return to their pre-war occupations, the formation of a Masonic Lodge at this time would establish and perpetuate the friendly relations of those who were then members of the Department.

A resolution in favour of the formation of the Lodge was unanimously agreed to, and W. Bro. Lieut. G. J. Ayling (who was then about to make an extended tour of the Provinces) was commissioned to make personal enquiries and ascertain the number of Master Masons eligible and willing to act as founders. Lieut. R. H. Bailey undertook the office of Acting Secretary.

A meeting of Founders, historic in the annals of the Lodge, was held at the Cafe Monico on August 16th, 1917, and a wonderful Masonic spirit was evinced, many of the Brethren on that occasion meeting one another for the first time. The arguments for the formation of the Lodge were eloquently put forward by Brig.-General Bagnall-Wild who occupied the Chair, and the resolution which had been passed at the meeting on May 7th was put and carried with acclamation.

At this meeting the Past Masters manifested an exemplary and truly Masonic spirit of unselfishness and self-sacrifice by unanimously

agreeing that they would not stand in the way of junior members of the Lodge of proved efficiency, in their progress through the various offices.

The following were proposed for the consideration of the W.M. Elect:—I.P.M. W. Bro. Dyball, P.M., L.R.; S.W. W. Bro. J. R. Smith, P.P.A.G.D.C., Essex; J.W. W. Bro. H. R. Bird, P.P.G.W., Essex; F.C. Lieut. G. J. Ayling, P.P.G.P., Berks. Treasurer W. Bro. A. Ashton, P.M. 733; J.D. W. Bro. H. J. Bush, P.G.T., Bucks.

The Petition to Grand Lodge signed by all the Founders was then practically ready for presentation. The A.I.D. first began its work at Farnborough, and it was therefore only appropriate that a local Lodge should act as sponsors for the new Lodge. The following is an extract from the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Aldershot Army and Navy Lodge, No. 1,971, held at the Officers' Club, Aldershot, on Friday, July 27th, 1917, Worshipful Deputy-Master R. K. Bagnall-Wild being in the Chair: W. Bro. H. Pidcock Hencell proposed and the S.W., W. Bro. H. D. Russell, seconded, "That the W.D.M. and Wardens be empowered to sign a Petition to the Most Worshipful Grand Master for the formation of a new Lodge to be called 'The Aerinspect Lodge.' The proposition was put by the S.W. and carried unanimously, and the signatures to the Petition were then appended in open Lodge. It will be noted that at a later date and before the actual Petition was submitted to Grand Lodge, the name "Aerinspect" was happily changed to "Ad Astra." Grand Lodge graciously honoured the Founders by granting their Petition, and early in September the charter for the new Lodge was delivered to the Acting Secretary.

The Consecration Ceremony was fixed for the 19th November, 1917, the Consecrating Officers appointed were:—

To those who were actively connected with the organisation of the Consecration Ceremony the help and advice of these distinguished Grand Lodge Officers will always be remembered.

The Consecration was an impressive ceremony, being attended by 230 Brethren, including the Founders and visitors, who represented a large

number of London and Provincial Lodges. The Consecrating Officers were elected honorary members of the Lodge, and to their number was added that of Major-Gen. Sir David Henderson, K.C.B., D.S.O., who was the father of the A.I.D. To commemorate the occasion a Founders' Jewel was struck and presented to each of the Consecrating Officers. This jewel was of somewhat unique design, showing the cylinders of an early Aero Engine set within an enamel circle, bearing the lettering "Ad Astra Lodge, No. 3,808," with a scroll beneath it inscribed "Per ardua nostra alteri ad astra." This device is suspended by a ribbon attached to the out-board wings of the R.A.F. surmounted by the Imperial Crown, with an inset enamel circle containing the letters "A.I.D." formed by an arrangement of the following characteristic tools of the Department; the caliper, the gauge and the micrometer.

During the W. Master's first year of office, nine regular and thirty emergency meetings were held. Eighty joining Members were elected and seventy-four gentlemen were initiated, forty-seven passed and thirty-two raised, a record which establishes the extraordinary hard work carried out by the W.M. and his Officers. During this year the W.M. attended the Festival of the Royal Benevolent Institution, and took up with him a list of fourteen Stewards and subscriptions amounting to £250. Towards the conclusion of the year the question of a suitable successor to the W.M. was the subject of prolonged and earnest consideration by the Management Committee. The Past Masters, true to their resolution not to accept office, refrained from nominating any of their number, and as no other Brother in the Lodge had served the office of Warden, it was decided by the Committee to suggest to the Brethren at the regular meeting in October, 1918, that they should seriously consider the qualifications of the W.M. for election to the Chair for a second year. The ballot proved unanimously in favour of W. Bro. Bagnall-Wild continuing as W.M. for another year.

The occasion of his re-installation on November 16th, 1918, was marked by the presentation to him of a P.M. Jewel. At the same time a Banner, subscribed for by the whole of the initiates of his first year, and designed by Miss Symonds, and worked at her School of Embroidery, Oxford Street, London, was presented to him in Lodge by Bro. Major Myers, the first initiate, Bros. Capt. A. E. Steele and Capt. F. Gay acting on this occasion as standard bearers.

The W.M. made it a condition of his acceptance of this Banner that he should present it to the Lodge for its use in perpetuity, but that in the event of the withdrawal of the Lodge's Charter for any reason whatsoever, the Banner should revert to his family.

W. Bro. Bagnall-Wild was also the recipient of a magnificent silver cedar-lined cigar box, together with a piece of plate for Mrs. Bagnall Wild, presented by Bro. Major Myers on behalf of the initiates during the year.

It may be here noted that during the first year of the Lodge, commemorative cups in silver gilt, suitably inscribed, were presented by the Lodge to the W.M., W. Bro. Lieut. G. J. Ayling, D.C., and W. Bro. G. H. Dyball, I.P.M., for the great and valuable work they had done for the success of the Lodge in general; also a gold watch was presented to Bro. R. H. Bailey as a mark of the Lodge's appreciation for his work as first Secretary.

During the Worshipful Master's second year of office the Lodge fully maintained its popularity, and progressed as steadily and rapidly as during its first year. Nine Regular and Twenty-seven Emergency Meetings were held, and fifteen Joining Members were elected and Thirty-one gentlemen initiated.

In February a most successful Ladies' Night was held at the Café Monico, at which just under 200 people were present. As a memento of the occasion every lady was presented with a cigarette box suitably engraved, and following the banquet many distinguished London entertainers gave their services.
