- 3. The Deputy Provincial Grand Master having taken up his position, the vessels of Core Wine, Oil, and Salt will be deposited on a pedestal for their reception.
 - 4. The Worshipful Deputy Provincial Grand Master will address the Assembly.
 - 5. Brother The Rev. A. J. Stockham, Provincial Grand Chaplain, will offer up Praye

- II. The Deputy Provincial ('rard Master wh' now prove the just position and form of the stone by the Plumb Rule, Level, and Square, which will be successively delivered to him by the Provincial Grand Junior Warden, the Provincial Grand Senior Warden, and the Acting Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Being satisfied in these particulars, he will give the Stone three knocks with the Mallet, which will be delivered to him by the Worshipful Master of Lodge No. 377.
- 12. The Corn, copia, containing the Corn, and the Ewers, with the Wine, Oil, and Salt, will next be handed to the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, who will strew the Corn and pour the Wine and Oil, and sprinkle Salt over the Stone with the accustomed ceremonies.
 - T'e Provincial Grand Chaplain will give the Dedication Prayer
- The Architect, Mr. Gilbert Scott, will be presented to the Deputy Provincial Grand Master and will acliver the plans of the Building.
- The Deput, Provincial Grand Master, having inspected the plan of the intended building, will deliver the sime to the Architect and desire him to proceed without loss of time to the compprecion of the work in conformity with the plan.
