The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will graciously be pleased to reply.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will be pleased to confer Masonic Honours on certain Brethren, and will signify his pleasure that Provincial and District Grand Masters shall be entitled to confer Honours in their Provinces and Districts in celebration of the occasion, and that certain appointments be made to London Rank.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master will present Hall Stone Lodge Medals to the Representatives of qualified Lodges.

Grand Lodge will be Closed in ample form, and a Hymn, and the National Anthem sung by all the Brethren.

The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, accompanied by the Visiting Deputations and his Grand Officers, will retire in procession from Grand Lodge.

BRETHREN must appear in Black Morning or Frock Coat, Black Tie, White Gloves and Craft Clothing.

The Apron must be worn *outside* the coat and not underneath.

PROVINCIAL AND DISTRICT GRAND OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF LONDON RANK to wear the Apron, Collar and Jewel of their respective Ranks.

MASTERS, PAST MASTERS and WARDENS *must* wear the Apron, Light Blue Collar and Jewel of their respective Offices.

Jewels or Emblems appertaining to Craft or Royal Arch Masonry may alone be worn.

Brethren bringing Coats and Hats must take them into the Hall and place them under their seats, out of view.

Brethren are strongly recommended not to bring their Clothing in Boxes, for which no provision can be made.
