NOTES

- A. TWO OF THESE GLITTERING STAR LODGE MASONIC HEWELS WERE FOUND WITH THE SAME ACCESSION NUMBER, AC 1027, ON 21/9/95 THE ITEM ATTRIBUTED TO F M SIR CLAUD JACOB WAS EXTRACTED AND BROUGHT ON ACCESSION AS AC 1944
- B. THE JEWEL, HANGING FROM A 31 MM WIDTH RIBBON EQUALLY DIVIDED WHITE/GREEN/WHITE, COMPRISES A NAVAL CROWN WHICH SURMOUNTS A WORC R 8-POINTED STAR, WITHIN WHICH A GREEN CARTER CARRYING THE WORDING '29TH REGIMENT' SURROUNDS A MASONIC SYMBOL OF COMPASSES ABOVE SET-SQUARE, WITH LETTER 'G' CENTRAL TO THE WHOLE. A SUSPENDER BAR CARRIES THE WORDING 'GLITTERING STAR', A BAR POSITIONED CENTRALLY ON THE RIBBON LENGTH CARRIES THE WORDING 'NO 322 IC' AND A BAR AT THE BASE OF THE RIBBON CARRIES THE WORDING '3RD MAY 1759'. IT IS IN SILVER GILT, WITH THE MANUFACTURERS NAME OF SPENCER, LONDON; IT IS UN-NAMED AND BEARS THE ASSAY MARKS FOR BIRMINGHAM 1936
