THIS GLITTERING STAR LODGE MASONIC COMMEMORADIVE MEDAL WAS STRUCK TO COMMEMORATE THE FIRST HOLDING AND WORKING OF A MASONIC LODGE IN THE TOWER OF LONDON ON 3/6/38, DURING 1 WORC YOUR OF DUTY THERE. THE MEDAL IS CIRCULAR, OF 1 1/2 INS DIAMETER, OXYDISED SILVER NEARLY 1/8 INS THICKNESS, AND IS UNNAMED. THE OBVERSE CARRIES A REPRESENTATION OF THE TOWER OF LONDON FROM THE RIVER, IN BAS RELIEF, ABOVE AN EXERGUE WITH RAISED LETTERING 'JUNE 3RD 1938'. THE REVERSE, IN RAISED CAPITAL LETTERING, REALS IN COMMEMORATION OF/THE FIRST/MEETING OF A/FREEMASONS LODGE/IN THE TOWER/OF/LONDON'. THE MEDAL IS FITTED WITH A SMALL SUSPENSION RING AND IS HUNG FROM A RECTANGULAR SUSPENDER WITH RAISED EDGING AND LEWERING WITHIN 'GLITTERING STAR LODGE NO 322 IC', BY A RIEBON OF 31 MM WIDTH, WHITE WITH DARK GREEN EDGE BANDS EACH OF 9 MM WIDTH
- B. ALTHOUGH FULL ACCESSION DETAILS ARE NOT HELD, A DISPLAY NOTE WITH THE MEDAL READS 'PRESENTED BY MR E I SERCOMBE. EDITOR OF THE ALDERSHOT NEWS, 1916-45', FOR DISPLAY PURPOSES, THE MEDAL WAS MOUNTED WITH THE FOLLOWING TYPED NOTE: 'LODGE GLITTERING STAR. 29TH (WORCESTERSHIRE) REGIMENT. 1759. A MEDAL TO COMMEMORATE THE FIRST HOLDING AND WORKING OF A MASONIC LODGE IN THE TOWER OF LONDON ON JUNE 3RD, 1938. BEING A LODGE OF THE TRISH CONSTITUTION THE MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER OF IRELAND WAS PRESENT WITH A DISTINGUISHED GATHERING OF MASONS. FIELD MARSHAL SIR CLAUT JACOB, PAST GRAND WARDEN OF ENGLAND AND COLONEL OF THE WORCESTERSHIRE REGIMENT, WAS THEN CONSTABLE OF THE TOWER AND GAVE PERMISSION FOR THE MEETING TO BE HELD, AS WELL AS ATTENDING'
- C. A FRINTED 8-PAGE REPORT OF THE MEETING, IN BOOKLET FORM, RECORDED BY V W PRO E J T SERCOMBE, WHO INITIATED AND CARRIED THROUGH THE IDEA, IS HELD AT RHQ. THE COMMEMORATIVE MEDAL IS NOT MENTIONED IN THE BOOKLET, BUT ALSO HELD AT RHQ ARE TWO PRINTED LETTERS CIRCULATED BY SERCOMBE FROM HIS ADDRESS AT 'HERNECLIFFE', ST MICHAEL'S ROAD, ALDERSHOT TO LODGE MEMBERS ADVISING FIRSTLY THAT APPLICATION HAD BEEN MADE TO GRAND LODGE FOR OFFICIAL APPROVAL FOR A SPECIAL SILVER COMMEMORATION JEWEL, WITH A GREEN AND WHITE RIBBON, TO MARK THE OCCASION, AND SECONDLY ADVISING THAT THE JEWEL HAD BEEN APPROVED AND THAT MEMBERS AND ENTITLED VISITORS COULD PURCHASE THE JEWEL FROM HIM FOR 17 SHILLINGS AND SIX PENCE

- WHITE/GREEN/WHITE, COMPRISES A NAVAL CROWN Which Surmounts A WORC R 8-POINTED STAR, WITHIN WHICH A GREEN CARTER CARRYING THE WORDING '29TH REGIMENT' SURROUNDS A MASONIC SYMBOL OF CONPASSES ABOVE SET-SQUARE, WITH LETTER 'G' CENTRAL TO THE WHOLE. A SUSPENDER BAR CARRIES THE WORDING 'GLITTERING STAR', A PAP POSITIONED CENTRALLY ON THE RIBBON LENGTH CARRIES THE WORDING 'NG 322 IC', AND A BAR AT THE BASE OF THE RIBBON CARRIES THE WORDING '3RD MAY 1759'. IT IS IN SILVER GILT, WITH THE MANUFACTURERS NAME OF SPENCE? CONDON; IT IS UN-NAMED AND BEARS THE ASSAY MARKS FOR BIRMINGHAM 1336
