Foreword

As part of the Centenary Celebrations, the Brethren of the Lodge of Stability No. 564 are publishing a History of the Lodge, covering the past hundred years.

It is therefore unnecessary in this Foreword to refer at length or in detail to its activities.

It should be noted that this Lodge was not the first to bring the light of Masonry to Stourbridge, for we find slight references to two Lodges with Warrants dated 1733 and 1768 which met at the Talbot Hotel, and fuller information of the "Hope" Lodge which met at the "Three Tuns" Inn in 1775 and was meeting at the "Crown" Inn in 1802. Recently I have been frequence in finding a copy of the Bye-Laws of this Lodge print d in Stourbridge in 1800. This Lodge was erased in 1828 and if there were any survivors they took no part in the founding of the Lo ge of Stability.

Sometime in 1849 a meeting of Brethren resident in Stourbridge and neighbourhood was held when it was decided that Bro. Charles Curran (a P.M. of Faithfull Logge No. 096—now No. 473) should be asked to prepare Petition for a new Lodge and become its first Master.

Bro. Curran prepared the Petition which was sponsored by the Faithful Lodge No. 696 and the Harmonic Lodge, Dudley (then numbered 313) and on Jun 10th, 1849, he wrote to the Dep. Prov. G.M. for Worcest rshire (D. Roden), stating that the Brethren proposed to present the Petition for his consideration. In due course our Chaster or Warrent was issued and it is dated 28th June, 1849. The Lodge was authorised to meet and transact all Masonic business after the receipt of the Warrant, and did so although the Lodge was not consecrated until January 23rd, 1850. The Lodge initiated our Brethren during 1849 and paid Grand Lodge Dues for that year.

The Brethren who signed the Petition were:

Faithful Lodge No. 696 Pro. Edward Peters ... Faithful Lodge No. 696 Wor Bro. William Masefield ... Harmonic Lodge No. 313 Bro. Thomas Rawlins Mount Sinai Lodge No. 142 Penzance (now numbered 121)

Bros. C. Curran, R. Martin and W. J. Pringle were the Master and Wardens designate in the Warrant.

The following Brethren were treated as Founders although they did not sign the Petition: Thomas Coldwall Hassall, Joseph Aston (Harmonic 313), John Weldon, James Nesbitt Evans, and in the list of Officers Bro. Curran submitted to the Deputy Prov. G.M. Bro. Hassall is Treasurer, Bro. Joseph Aston is S.D. and Bro. Weldon I.G.

The first regular meeting of the Lodge was held on 16th July, 1849. It was held at the "Vine" Inn, Stourbridge, of which Bro. Ford, one of the Petitioners, was landlord. At this meeting the Master designate was unable to be present and Wor. Bro. William Masefield occupied the Chair.

Before its Consecration the Lodge purchased the Furniture, Jewels and Regalia of the St. John's Lodge No. 431 Lichfield which had recently lapsed. Much of this equipment is in use to-day and the I.P.M.'s and Treasurer's Jewels are of a pattern no longer sanctioned. The Volume of the Sacred Law was two hundred years old when we acquired it and was printed in 1639.

The Lodge was duly consecrated by the Wor. Depuy C.M. (Dr. Roden) on January 23rd, 1850. Wor. Bro. Wm. Masefield acted as Prov. G.S.W., Wor. Bro. A. Patterson as Pov. G.J.W. and Wor. Bro. Thomas Hodges was Prov. G. Secretary.

It is surprising to us weaker Brethren to han that before the Consecration Ceremony the Lodge was opened and a Candidate was Initiated, one Brother Passed and the Raised.

The Financial beginnings of this Lodge also are startling, for we find that the Founders paid no Founders' Pees and the Lodge started on a loan of £50 from the Treasure Schich he subsequently converted into a gift. Sill, our celeo ations today shew that our name "Stability" was right notwichstanding the slender financial foundation up in which the Lodge was built.

The Lodge had to lepend upon its Initiates almost entirely for its working Officer. The Petition is had evidently become Founders only to start the Lodge. Wor Bro. Wm. Masefield resigned in 1851 and never went into the Chair. The Master and Wardens designate in the Charte early attended the Lodge after they had passed the Chair, and Whad resigned by 1855. Our Lodge in its early days really centred round Wor. Bro. Joseph Aston, who was the fourth Master and held that office four times. He was a Sound ridge man and lived at Stamber Mill. Our records show that for some years the Lodge depended on Wor. Bro. Wm. Masefield and other P.M.'s from Harmonic to form the Board of Installed and Masters at Installations. When Bro. Aston was installed for the second time he was the only Installed Master in the Lodge.

The Lodge met at the "Vine" Inn only until 1851 and in that year moved to the Talbot Hotel, which has been our masonic home ever since.

The Lodge membership has never been large and has never exceeded the present number. A few of us remember the time when we had only twenty-three members. Still, the comparatively small membership has had its compensations, for Brethren have had an opportunity of attaining the Chair within a reasonable time and we like to think that the small number has made our brotherly Association particularly close and friendly.

- A procession of Past Masters will be formed and retire from the Lodge.
- 14. The Past Masters will escort the Prov. Grand Secretary into the Lodge bearing the Centenary Warrant.

- The Worshipful the Deputy P.G.M. wid call upon the Secretary, Wor. Bro. Albert Grove, P.A.G.D.C., to give a short history of the Lodge.
- The Prov. Grand Chaplain will (fer up praya)
